### OPEN RIVER CO. MAY CHANGE HANDS

Portland, Ore., Jan. 21.—Commercial bodies and shippers of the upper Columbia and Snake rivers are co-operating with owners of river transportation companies in Portland in a proposition to take over the fleet and equipment of the Open River Transportation company, of this city, with a view to its continuous operation. The commercial organizations of the territory bordering on the Columbia-Snake waterway held a joint meeting at Pasco a week ago last Saturday and named a general committee to have charge of the work of securing co-operation of merchants, farmers and shippers with the proposed new line and during the past two days conferences have been held in this city with J. N. Teal and other officials of the Open River company.

Dr. N. G. Blalock of Walla Walla; Wallace R. Struble, secretary-manager of the Idaho-Washington Development League; Lewiston; Captain W. P. Gray, of Pasco; Dr. J. B. Morris, A. S. Stacy and Frank Thompson of Lewiston, represented the up-river constituency. Captain V. Degerstedt, Captain L. C. Hosford and Captain Arthur Riggs were present on behalf of the Clatskanie Transportation company and the Hosford Transportation company, who propose to take over the Open River company's fleet.

"The citizens of the Columbia-Snake basin are united in the purpose to give the open river service substantial cooperation," said Secretary Struble. "The opinion is universal among our shippers that abundant tonnage can be secured to make the continuous operation of the line a financial success. The essential concomitants are regularity and adequacy of service on the part of steamboat men and proper freight rates. It is the judgment of shippers well acquainted with the Upper Columbia and Snake rivers that at least a nine-
