FLANGES OF CAR WHEELS.

The railway commission has issued a circular to motive power foremen on the Canadian railways urging the importance of a renewal of locomotive wheels before the flanges are badly worn. Inspectors in the service of the commission report that many loco-

motives on passenger trains have sharp ridges worn down below the master car builders' standard allowance gauge. Some of these locomotives are running on fast passenger trains, thus inviting much unnecessary risk to the safety of hundreds of passengers.

As a rule, when a locomotive jumps the track, the accident is ascribed to some peculiar defect in the track, rather than to insufficient flanging on the locomotive. It is undeniable that many supposed rail defects are in reality the outcome of defective driving wheel treads. The Railway Age Gazette tells of 100 rails on an Illinois railroad being broken on one trip by a flattened driving wheel.
