M. on April 23rd, 1913, at his office in Pendleton, Oregon, for the improvement of that part of Webb Street, in said City lying between the East line of Cottonwood Street and the East line of College Street by paving the same with Gravel Bitulithic pavement, and placing thereon curbs, gutters and drainage system and others things, in accordance with the plans and specifications for such improvements now on file in the office of said Recorder, and which are open to inspection there. NOTICE OF STREET IMPROVEMENT.

Notice is hereby given that at a regular meeting of the Common Council of The City of Pendleton held on April 9th, 1913, the following resolutions were adopted: Whereas, the Surveyor of The City of Pendleton did on the 9th day of April, 1913, under direction and by requirement of the Common Council, lay out and specifications for an appropriate improvement of Haley Street, in The City of Pendleton from the West line of Bush Street to the West line of Short Street, together with the estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, with a statement of the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and the percentage of the total cost of improvement which each of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land should pay on account of the benefits to be derived from such improvement; and

Whereas, the Council has examined such plans and specifications and found the same satisfactory and the estimates therefor to be in accordance with the probable cost of such work; and

Whereas, the property recommended by the City Surveyor to be included within the boundaries of the district benefited is, in the judgment of the Common Council properly to be included within such improvement district, and no property is excluded therefrom which should properly be included therein; and

Whereas, the improvement of the hereinabove described portion of said Haley Street, with Gravel Bitulithic pavement is at this time necessary; therefore be it

Resolved, by the Common Council of The City of Pendleton that it is expedient to improve Haley Street from the West line of Bush Street to the West line of Short Street by paving the same with Gravel Bitulithic pavement, such pavement to be made and laid down, and the street to have curbs, gutters and all other things, and to be improved, in accordance with, and as shown in, the plans and specifications for the improvement of said portion of Haley Street prepared by Teary Kimbrell, City Surveyor, and filed with the Recorder of the City on the 9th day of April, 1913, which plans and specifications are herewith particularly referred to; and be it further

Resolved, that the plans and specifications and estimates of the work to be done as prepared by the City Surveyor and filed with the Recorder of The City of Pendleton on the 9th day of April, 1913, be and they are hereby approved and adopted; and be it further

Resolved, that the cost of making such improvement shall be a charge and lien up on all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and the owners of such lots, parts of lots, and parcels of land so specially benefited by such improvement shall be liable for the payment of the cost thereof; and be it further

Resolved, that an Assessment District is hereby created to be known as Assessment District No. 23, embracing all property to be assessed for the payment of such improvement, which assessment district shall include all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying and being within the district bounded and described as follows, to-wit: Commencing at the S.
