Steamboat Inspection Rules Amended. Washington, D. C., May 5.—Secretary of Commerce William C. Redfield has approved certain changes in the rules and regulations governing the steamboat inspection service made by an executive committee of the board of supervising inspectors which met at the direction of the secretary in New York City on April 18.

Probably the most important change is one relating to the credit to be given for experience on motor boats to applicants for licenses as masters of coastwise steamers. The regulation formerly read as follows: "Practical service on the deck department of an ocean-going or coastwise steam yacht shall be accepted, when offered in documentary evidence by any person applying for an original

license or raise of grade on ocean-going or coastwise steam vessels, as being or coastwise steam vessels, as being in any ocean-going or coastwise steam passenger vessel."

As amended, the words "vessel propelled by machinery" have been substituted for the words "steam yacht," thereby permitting many men who have had training and experience on ocean-going and coastwise motor yachts and who were formerly prevented from obtaining licenses as masters of coastwise steamers to secure admission to the examination given to applicants for such licenses.

There were two other changes of importance made. The first was a new rule in regard to lifeboat equipment on motor boats under 50 tons burden subject to inspection, permit-

ting them to travel with a lifeboat capacity of only 100 cubic feet when navigating in daylight only and when equipped with air tanks under deck of sufficient capacity to sustain the vessel afloat when full of water and with a full complement of passengers on board, or when properly subdivided by iron or steel water tight bulkheads of sufficient strength and so arranged that the vessel will remain afloat with her full complement of passengers with any two compartments open to the sea. The second was a new rule permitting the licensing as masters of lake, bay, sound or river steamers of persons who have served five years on sail vessels, one year of which has been as master,

Porch Shelf for Packages.

Such a simple thing as a shelf at the back door, inside the storm porch, saves many steps and much trouble for one woman who does her own work, writes a contributor to Good Housekeeping. I found that I must keep the back door locked to prevent the delivery men from stalking in with dirty feet. Then, when they knocked, I must travel from cellar or garret to let them in. This would not do. I had a broad shelf placed inside our storm porch, which remains up all the year. I put a sign on the back door which reads, "Delivery men will please put packages on the shelf and depart without rapping." Now I go to my door at my convenience, and bring in what has been left. If I am away there is a place where parcels can be left.

Home Helps.

A teaspoonful of turpentine boiled with your white clothes will greatly aid the whitening process.

If moths have attacked a carpet, work powdered borax into the carpet wherever there is a sign of the insects.

When using oil for frying, the oil taste can be taken away by making the oil very hot, and then try a piece of onion in it. When brown, take it out.

Vinegar in which home-made cucumber pickles have been preserved should not be thrown away, but used in salad dressing. The flavor is delicious and cannot be gained in any other way.

To have boiled potatoes fluffy, pour the water off when they are done, then let them stand in the dish they were in on the back of the stove for a few minutes, giving them an occasional shake.—Pittsburg Sun.

TELEGRAPHIC BRIEFS

St. Louis, May 5.—Dr. Lyman Abbott was removed from the list of vice presidents of the American Peace Society because he signed appeal of the navy league for large naval appropriations. Objection to the name of Dr. Abbott among the list of vice presidents was made by Charles E. Beals of Chicago, secretary of the Chicago Peace Society. Mr. Beals also objected to the report of the nominating committee, expressing the opinion that the committee seemed to think the western boundary of the United States was at Buffalo.

Lynchburg, Va., May 5.—Miss Dorothy Cure of Roanoke, Va., cleared 15 feet 2 1/2 inches on a running broad jump in the annual athletic meet at the Randolph-Macon woman's college here making what is claimed to be the world's record for women in that event. Her performance broke the college record by 9 1/2 inches and is believed to eclipse the world's record by 8 1/2 inches.

Walla Walla, Wash., May 5.—Fourteen special speakers will travel over 12,000 miles to attend the Walla Walla district Sunday school convention, to be held here May 14-16 inclusive. The patronizing district for this convention embraces Adams, Benton, Columbia, Franklin, Klickitat, Yakima and Walla Walla counties. Practically every Sunday school being entitled to four. One and one-third fare on all railroads has been granted on the certificate plan, and a large attendance is expected. Dr. U. B. Shantz is at the head of the local committee which is already making preparations for the meetings, which will be held in one of the local churches.

El Paso, May 5.—Revolting federal soldiers of Salazar's command looted the American Mormon settlement of Colonial Dublin last week, according to reports reaching here by mail. American-owned stores were robbed of \$4000 in goods.

Peter Woyline was forced to defend his home and family when the Mexicans attempted to enter the house. A bullet pierced the thick wall and hit the American near the eye. An American in an adjoining colony was reported killed.
