Washington, May 20.—By vigorous protest against what he considers the loose manner in which money is appropriated for the Indian service, Senator Lane brought about an adjournment of hearings on the Indian bill for one week, during which time the commissioner of Indian affairs will prepare a detailed statement of how the money is to be expended.

Senator Lane protested that the appropriation of \$9,000,000 was being made in a manner which would permit the whole amount, almost, to be spent for big powder at the discretion of the various Indian agents. He caused more than a flutter in the

It was a rude shock to senatorial courtesy, for these appropriation bills have been made in lump sums for many years. Senator Lane said he had encountered just such methods of financing when he was mayor of Portland and he said he could not stand for it here any more than he could there.

Replying to Chairman Stone's suggestion that Lane allow the bill to go through the Oregon man leaned across the table and exclaimed: "If you let it go through in this form, the republicans will get you. The bill is loaded."

Appropriations for Oregon include: 600 Indian pupils at Salem, \$102,900; Walla, Cayuse, Umatilla, \$30,000; for Warm Springs agency, \$40,000; Walla for repairs, etc., Salem, \$12,000; Grand Ronde and Siletz agencies, \$4,000; Modoc Point irrigation project, \$105,000; salary E. L. Chalkcraft, Salem, \$734.88.

Interesting Stories from Various Cities

Oetroit, May 20.—Safety appliances installed in factories and industrial establishments during the past year have greatly reduced loss of life and the percentage of injured employees according to reports made today at the opening session of the annual convention of the National Association of Manufacturers at the Hotel Pontchartrain. There was some difference of opinion expressed in speeches on the effectiveness of the workingmen's compensation acts passed by the legislatures of various states. Several

interesting papers were read this afternoon in which all large factories and other industrial establishments were urged to institute apprentice schools. The convention will close Wednesday evening. This is the first time in the history of the organization that its annual convention has been held outside of New York City.

St. Petersburg, May 20.—Two hundred thousand dollars worth of powder was shot away today throughout Russia in celebration of the 45th birthday of Czar Nicholas. It is estimated the \$100,000 worth of powder was used in firing hourly salutes at the fortress of St. Peter and Paul and during the morning celebration in St. Petersburg. Thanksgiving services were held in all the Greek orthodox churches and a great military and naval parade was held later. Afterwards the Czar reviewed his royal guard and received a score of official deputations.

New York, May 20.—Peace Day was celebrated in the public and private schools yesterday. Local officials of the National Peace association were in charge of the celebration here, and planned similar celebration in public and private schools throughout the nation.

PACIFIC COAST NEWS

Salem, Ore., May 20.—Governor West, president of the Western Governors' conference which will be held June 5 to 7 in Salt Lake, has extended invitations to President Wilson and Secretary Lane of the interior department to be present. As western land development is going to be the big feature of the conference it is hoped that Secretary Lane will attend.

Salem, Ore., May 20.—According to Arthur Benson, assistant clerk of the supreme court, the next class to take the state bar examination will be the largest the state has ever had. The examination will begin June 3. Benson estimates that more than 150 persons will be present to run the gamut of legal questions.

Los Angeles, May 20.—School authorities here have been called upon to arbitrate a difference of opinion between teachers of the Hoover street grammar school and parents who refuse to permit their children to dance with negro children. Mrs. W. F. Gilbert complained to the board of education that her small boy had been sent home because he refused to dance a folk dance with a little negro girl. School authorities have promised to investigate.

Seattle, May 20.—Seattle will send at least 25 veterans to the Gettysburg reunion this year, which will observe the fiftieth anniversary of the famous battle. Applications are being passed on by Adjutant General Llewellyn. The state has appropriated \$15,000 to pay the expenses of the needy veterans.

Pomona, Cal., May 20.—In Pomona they take fires to the engine house to be extinguished. Finding his load of household goods on fire, an automobile truck driver threw on all speed and headed for the fire house where a can of chemical extinguisher did the work.
