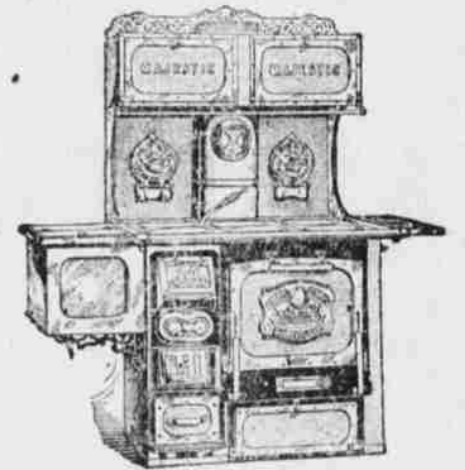
# The Majestic "Walking" Cake

tion, not a state issue, and it becomes the duty of all to uphold the national government in its course. It may be taken for granted the administration will act with prudence yet with firmness in upholding American rights. All actions thus far indicate as much.

There are some who have the view the federal government has taken a pro-Japanese attitude and has gone to extremes in striving to prevent the passage of an alien land law in California. They gain that impression from the fact that the administration has been open and above board in all that has been done in dealing with California. As a matter of fact the Wilson administration has been more friendly to the California feeling on this subject than was either the Taft or Roosevelt administrations. The Roosevelt administration made the treaty or agreement with Japan that is the basis of all the present trouble. The Roosevelt administration also used the big stick to force San Francisco to allow Japanese in white schools. Two years ago the Taft administration squelched an attempt at anti-Japanese legislation in California by using dictatorial methods. Wilson and Bryan have followed a different course entirely. In what they have done they have acted openly and they have used no club. On the contrary they have made it plain they were merely advising California and would not interfere with the right of that sovereign state to pass such laws as it pleased provided they were in conformity with the constitution and violated no treaty obligations.

In view of that attitude no one need fear the national government will be weak in asserting California's right when dealing with Japan. Nor should friends of peace be alarmed since the present secretary of state is a champion of world peace. The situation insures there will be no war unless there is a war coming. At present there seems no possibility of trouble but we will know more when Japan's reply is received.
