BRAVES LOSE TO THE BEARS, 6-3

Walla Walla, July 2.—Outplayed, but lucky, the Bears placed themselves within half a game of the championship of the mid-season schedule, by their victory over the Yakima Braves at Sportsman Park yesterday afternoon the score ending 6 to 3. One more victory here (or one victory of Pendleton over Boise) and Walla Walla wins the honors for the first half of the season over Boise, whose team is making a hard run in hopes that Yakima might shut out the Bears. Another game is necessary because of the extra game scheduled on the Fourth and there will be no easy pickings in obtaining it, judging from the manner in which Manager Engel's proteges are conducting themselves on the local sod.

Welch had almost as bad a day yesterday as Leonard on Tuesday but played under a horse shoe all through the game and won on timely hitting and two costly errors by the Yakima infield. The way that Yakima offense is looming up, there is going to be some tough sledding to break it down in the next series. The men secured from Baker and La Grande have filled the spots most weak in Engel's machine and now the team is well balanced and playing baseball.

It seemed like Yakima's game from the start yesterday, the Bears being unable to connect for several innings while the Braves were threatening the score sheet frequently, with Welch working hard to stop them.

The Braves scored first in the fourth when Harrod, a third baseman who is opening a few eyes, hit through second and first, was sacrificed to second by Stolke, took third on Fuller's hit and scored on Taylor's sacrifice fly.

The Bears earned a run in the fifth, Lundstrum walking, stealing second, and scoring on Brown's two bagger. Cap couldn't stand the agony of seeing his men fall down at the bat any longer and so slammed her out for a Texas leaguer.

The Braves came near scoring in the fifth and the sixth and would have had they been as lucky as the Bears, but fate seemed to work against them.

In the sixth Johnson opened for the Bears with a walk. In attempting to sacrifice him, Borleske was safe at first on Fuller's error of a thrown ball. Davis hit, advancing them both but was himself cut off at second when caught between bases. Martini came up and hit a single over second, scoring Johnson and Borleske.

In the eighth the Braves weakened on defense and let three runs slip across, but one of them earned. Borleske went out, Engel to Fuller. Davis walked the second time, took second on Grovers' error of Martini's easy grounder and with two on, Sheely flew out to Harrod and Lundstrum hit through Engel, scoring Davis. Childers then surprised the fans with a neat bingle over second for another score by Martini.

In the ninth, Taylor opened for Yakima, flying out to Johnson. Peterson hit for Lockhard and was passed to first, Welch weakening. Ford struck out but with two down, Engel walked, Nadeau and Grover hit, scoring Peterson and Engel. Harrod finally ended the rally, grounding out Lundstrum to Sheely.

USE PLAIN STAMPS FOR ANYTHING NOW

Parcel post, special delivery and registered stamps have been abolished and the little red and green stickers such as everyone uses to send letters and post cards are good for everything that Uncle Sam can give in the line of postal service, according to an order from Postmaster General Burleson, which took effect Monday.

To simplify the postal service and make it easier for everyone to transact business with the postoffice department, is the reason given for establishing a one-stamp system. An ordinary postage stamp can now be used for special delivery, registered mail or parcel post and the parcel post stamps, so long as they last are good on letters or other mail matter.

For six months the federal government has been trying out the parcel post and figuring up the sale of the specially made stamps to determine whether the institution is a success or not. So well has the parcel post justified the action of the department that the stamps, by which the amount of receipts were checked, were eliminated. With the idea of doing away with the confusing number of stamps came that of cutting out all the other varieties and letting the simple postage stamp bear the entire burden.

the postoffice department for some time. It means that the manufacture of parcel post, special delivery, registered mail and every other kind and variety except the simple postage will be discontinued. These special stamps will be sold until the supply runs out.

ALL WOOL CLIPS ARE SOLD

Fear of Free Wool Is Responsible—Sales Are Held at Baker

Baker, Ore., July 3.—At the second wool sales' day held in Baker yesterday, nearly all the wool clips were sold. Although in smaller lots than local clips the Grant county wool seems to be a favorite as stronger bids were offered for the clip of William Wiedman, bringing the owner 13 5-8c, while the average price paid was 11 to 13 cents.
