FIRST UNIT IN IRRIGATION PLAN READY IN STATE

Will Proceed With Plans for Reclamation of 10,000 Acres on Umatilla Project.

WASHINGTON, July 19.—It may be doubted whether any other single problem has received so much of the consideration, time and effort of the senators and representatives from Oregon in the past half dozen years as the West Umatilla Irrigation project. In view of the fact, as already noted, that the secretary of the interior has consented to the extension of this reclamation project, there is manifested deep satisfaction among the Oregonians in congress.

This is particularly so of Senator Chamberlain, who has been constant in season and out of season, in urging the interior department to take action on this matter. He has called at the interior department perhaps 50 times on this subject alone. It has been considered by three secretaries of the interior and has been the subject of many reports.

It has, seemingly, been on the verge of receiving official sanction only to be turned down for some more or less inscrutable reason. And at last it has received official indorsement and the reclamation service has instructions, or authority, to proceed with plans for the reclamation of the first unit of 10,000 acres on the West Umatilla extension.

Large Acreage Available.
Possibly 100,000 acres are available for reclamation under this project. Perhaps the area suitable for irrigation may be even larger. While this unit can be made a completed project in itself, the expectation is that it will be but the start of a great irrigation system—as its designation implies, the first unit.

Naturally there will be considerable interest over the price at which this land will be turned over to settlers. The engineers, cautious because of past experience, have estimated that the cost can not well exceed \$100 an acre, but they expect that it will be within \$80. The limit that any one settler may take up will probably be 40 acres. The secretary of the interior has authority to fix the size of the farm units. A condition for the opening of this extension is that the Oregon Land and Water company will agree to a modification of its decree to the effect that these lands may be sold in farm units to be fixed by the secretary of the interior not exceeding those fixed for the Northern Pacific lands in the same project.

"I think that the Oregon Land and Water company will comply with this request," said Senator Chamberlain in discussing the project. "The Northern Pacific not only consented to this, but even allowed the secretary of the interior to fix a price for the sale of the land."

CAUSE OF FIRE IS A MYSTERY

Socialist Hall in Baker is Destroyed—No One Was in Building at the Time.

BAKER, Ore., July 19.—The local socialist party is undecided as to the advisability of rebuilding their hall near Third on Center street which was nearly destroyed by fire. The matter will no doubt have to come before a meeting of the party before anything definite in the matter will be done.

The origin of the fire is still unknown. It is stated there was no one in the building at the time. The blaze had gained such headway when the alarm was turned in that the fire department had hard time coping with the flames. Effort was directed toward saving the stores of Max Ellias and William Warfel, which adjoin the frame structure. The loss to the building is \$2500 with \$1500 insurance.

The building was erected last year by the socialist organization and has been used for lectures and dances.
