GAME LOOKED LIKED YAKIMA'S BUT BUCKS GET TOGETHER AND WIN OUT

After handing the game to Yakima in the first few innings by a succession of errors and misplays, the Buckaroos yesterday came from behind and atoned for their faulty fielding by humbling Peterson in the seventh and eighth. In this humbling they were given valiant assistance by Netzel, the Brave second sacker. In each of these frames the Bucks slipped three across the rubber, making the final reading, Pendleton 8, Yakima 4.

The game started rotten enough to make a knacker of the most loyal fan. King began the comedy of boots in the first by a wide throw to first but fortunately there were two down and Berger was able to pull through without a score. In the second, however, they had effect. Dean dropped the ball after gathering in Stokke's hard drive. A hit by Harrod and a couple of bad errors by Augustus put over the first score and Peterson's two very sweet added another Ford grounded out but Fuller walked, filling the bases. Nadeau popped up a little infield fly which made the second out automatically. Umpire Jimmie Richardson became confused, however, and when the ball was thrown to third ruled that Peterson was forced out. The decision caused an uproar and ended in the protest of the game by Manager Gordon.

In the third Netzel's single, Grovers' sacrifice and Augustus' third bob made the score three to nothing for the visitors. In the fourth, however, Pendleton broke into the run column. Lodell reached second on Netzel's overthrow to first. Varian sent the next one at the Yak second sacker and it eluded his mit by a bad little bounce. Lodell scoring. Varian was forced at second on Haworth's infield ball and Haworth was in turn forced by Dean, who stole second. Peterson walked and he and Dean pulled off a double steal by virtue of a little home-headed work by Fuller. King's hit over pitcher added the second score. The Braves went down in one, two, three order until the seventh when an error, a hit by Nadeau and a double steal gave them their fourth and last score.

It was in the seventh also that the Bucks solved the delivery and curves of Peterson. Up until this inning he had allowed but three hits, two of which were of the scratch variety. Dean opened by hitting a slow one to first and beating it out and Peterson, the new Pendleton utility player, followed with a long triple to center. King's second pinch hit scored Peterson. Augustus sacrificed King to second from which station he was pushed around to the pan by Berger's single. The Pendleton twirler thus scoring the winning run. That was all in the seventh, but in the eighth

there was another trio of markers hung up.

Haworth walked but was forced at second by Dean. Dean purloined second and Peterson drew a pass. King flew out, making it two down and two on. Augustus erased his fielding record from the memory of the fans by delivering a blow across first which scored two runs and put the game on ice. Augie pliffed the next base and beat it to the plate for the last score of the game when Berger singled through second.

Summary—Left on bases, Yakima 6, Pendleton 5; two base hits, Netzel, Peterson of Yakima; three base hit, Peterson of Pendleton; double plays, Berger to Haworth to King, Naughton to Lodell; struck out, by Berger 11; by Peterson 2; base on balls, off Berger 1, off Peterson 3; sacrifice hits, none down but two men were caught at the plate and the third popped out. In the seventh with one down, Dean cracked out a double to center and advanced to third on Osborne's single. A double steal was started but Dean was caught at the plate. King laid down a fluke hit toward first and slid to safety, Osborne going to third and coming home when Netzel threw the ball over Harrod's head.

In the eighth a couple of hits and a walk again filled the bases, this time with one down, but Naughton was caught at the plate and Dean struck out.

Peet got out of a bad hole in the fourth but thereafter steadied down and held the Yaks scoreless until the ninth when Nadeau poled out a lone one which Varian reached but could not hold. This gave Whispering Phil two bases and he finished the circuit on Grovers' single. Stokke grounded out, ending the game.
