**Fine Fabrics in Evening Gowns.**  
The present fashion of evening gowns is admirably adapted to show the tall, slim figure to advantage, says the Washington Herald, and the fabrics used are of great beauty. White brocades have the sheen of the oyster shell, and the creamy tones with a broche design present quite a raised effect. Some of the handsome brocades have veillings of tinsel or designs in relief coloring; but the most beautiful have delicate shadings of orchid mauve, pink or blue. Pink is a very modish color for evening wear, and even when combined with white it invariably shows some touches of black. The sash plays a very important role in the toilette de ceremonie, and is shown in some variety. Shaped and fringed ends are general, but one end falls from the top of the belt, or, if there is one only, it is invariably arranged in this manner.

**MOURNING FROCK OF SERGE.**  
A simple street frock for mourning and morning wear this fall is shown above. Black serge was the material used for this, which had a plain peasant blouse. The little yoke which, by closing with a row of dull jet buttons, takes on the effect of a waistcoat is



made of dull black taffeta. This is outlined by two ruffles of the same. The turn-back cuffs of taffeta are finished in a similar manner. The skirt which is slightly draped below the hips is particularly well adapted to this material and produces a charming silhouette. The girdle also is of the black taffeta.

### STENCILED TILE EFFECTS IN BATHROOM VERY PLEASING

Probably the most satisfactory painted finish of bathroom walls is in stenciled tile effects, says the Decorator. The entire wall may be given this tile effect, or the tile design may be carried up as a dado to a height of some five feet where it should be capped with the border, and the wall painted in a plain tint above. For these tile designs light colors should be used in imitation of the tiles most generally used in bathrooms. Delft colorings are very popular, either dull blue or dull green on white or ivory white. Blue green on a background of pale cream is very pleasing, or a more pronounced green on a pale pink ground. Very light lemon yellow might be used as a ground color with the design stenciled in a light ochre tint.

## GOVERNOR WEST IS EMBARRASSING TO POLITICIANS

### "PASSES THE BUCK" TO EMERGENCY BOARD MEMBERS

Fate of Future Law Enforcement Hangs on Action of Opponents Who Are Candidates for Office—They Must Now Show Their Colors.

Whether or not there shall be a continuance of law enforcement in Pendleton and elsewhere throughout the state is going to depend on the action of the so-called emergency board which has been called by Governor West to meet in Salem tomorrow. In calling this meeting Governor West has shown the members of the board and there is evidence the politicians upon the board do not relish the predicament, as may be seen from the following story from Salem:

SALEM, Ore., Sept. 25.—There is considerable speculation here as to the probable results of the first meeting of the new emergency board, called for next Friday. The meeting has been called at the request of Governor West, who has asked for more funds with which to carry on his law enforcement, being chiefly his vice crusade activities. The last legislature appropriated \$1000 that can be used for this purpose, and that is now exhausted, and under the new law no delinquency can be incurred without authority from the emergency board. So the continuance of the governor's activities along these lines appears to depend entirely on the action of the emergency board.

It probably would not be difficult to forecast the action the board will take if that ever busy little creature, "politics," would keep away, because it cannot be successfully denied that the governor's agents are getting results; they are cleaning up the towns they go after, and are obtaining convictions and fines far in excess of the costs to the state. Moreover, the constitution of the state specifically imposes upon the governor the duty of seeing that the laws are faithfully executed. The retort cannot be made that the regularly elected officials are amply able to enforce the laws, because if they were enforcing the laws the governor's agents would find nothing to do. But when "politics" gets on the job it sometimes performs queer antics.

And yet there is room, it is pointed out, for a difference of opinion as to whether it is necessary for the governor to champion the cause of law enforcement as energetically as he is doing, and as to whether an emergency exists. This is where the speculation comes in. What view of the situation will the members of the emergency board take, when all but one or two of them are the governor's political enemies? Besides the governor, the board is comprised of Ben W. Olcott, secretary of state; T. B. Kay, state treasurer; Dan Malarky, president of the senate; C. N. McArthur, speaker of the house; T. L. Perkins, chairman of the senate ways and means committee; and J. D. Abbott, chairman of the house ways and means committee.

To make his law enforcement work effective, it will be remembered that the governor caused a score or more bills to be introduced in the last legislature, and because of the public sentiment in their favor which had been aroused by a vigorous publicity campaign conducted by the governor for several months prior to the legislative session, nearly all of them were enacted into law, until now there are ample teeth in the statutes relating to crimes and liquor regulations. Those in close touch with the legislative work recall at this time also that Speaker McArthur became so incensed at his fellow republicans for placing some of these weapons of law enforcement in the hands of a democratic governor that he went on the floor of the house and bitterly arraigned them for it. This occurred when the bill giving the governor authority to temporarily remove from office any district attorney, sheriff or other peace officer who failed or refused to do his duty and appoint an officer in his place for 90-day periods, was up for passage.

But public sentiment in favor of this sort of legislation was too strong for even the speaker, who was the head of a well organized republican machine, to hold the lawmakers in line against the bill. This incident indicates the attitude of Speaker McArthur at this time. All the legislative members of the board were machine leaders in the last assembly, and this may or it may not indicate their probable attitude at the meeting next Friday.

It is rumored here also that Attorney General Crawford will be asked for an opinion as to whether an emergency exists. If he, who has no political love for the chief executive, should hold that there was no emergency it is understood that this would cause matters considerably for some of the members who really do not want to grant the governor's request for funds but do not want to take the responsibility before the public.

At any event the continuance of the governor's law enforcement activities now rests in the hands of his political enemies. Under the law it will take five out of the seven members of the board to authorize the delinquency. The members of the board are politicians. Most of them will be up for office at the next election.
