

WHEAT STRONG BUT OPENS LOW

Chicago Has Not Gone of 5-8 Cent at Closing; Opening Figures Are Down a Fraction.

CHICAGO, Oct. 11.—Wheat turned strong after an opening 1-8c lower than Thursday and closed with a net advance of 5-8c for each of the two options.

There was only momentary weakness at the start during which shorts began to make up their minds to get under cover. There was nothing in the foreign situation to cause this. The advance was probably due to the fact that the government report was not as bearish as some had anticipated.

Broomhall cabled from Liverpool that wheat opened lower influenced by the weaker Winnipeg cables and forecast of larger Russian shipments this week and larger world's shipment.

There were no arrivals for the open market at North Portland during the last 24 hours, the total run of six loads being a direct shipment to the Union Meat company.

Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Pendleton, on the 17th day of September, 1913, did make an assessment for the improvement of Webb Street in the City of Pendleton, from the east line of Cobble Street to the West line of Tutuilla Street, and did assess the contract price for making said improvement against the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land, specially benefited thereby. Notice is hereby given that at a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pendleton, held on October 3rd, 1913, the following Resolution was adopted: "Whereas the surveyor of the City of Pendleton, did on the 3rd day of October, 1913, under direction and by requirement of the Common Council file plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of Alta Street from the West line of Main Street to the West line of Chestnut Street and of Chestnut Street from the South line of Alta Street to the North line of Webb Street, in said City of Pendleton, together with the estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, with a statement of the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and the percentage of the total cost of improvement which each of such lots, parts of lots and parcels should pay on account of the benefits to be derived from such improvement; and Whereas, the Council has examined such plans and specifications and found the same satisfactory and the estimates therefor to be in accordance with the probable cost of such work; and Whereas, the property recommended by the City Surveyor to be included within the boundaries of the district benefited is, in the judgment of the Common Council, property to be included within such improvement and no property is excluded therefrom which should properly be included therein; and Whereas, the improvement of the hereinabove described portions of said Alta Street and Chestnut Street with gravel bitulithic pavement is at this time necessary; therefore, be it Resolved, by the Common Council

of the City of Pendleton that it is expedient to improve and it is hereby proposed to improve Alta Street from the West line of Main Street to the West line of Chestnut Street, and Chestnut Street from the South line of Alta Street to the North line of Webb Street by paving the same with gravel bitulithic pavement, such pavement to be made and laid down, and the street to have curbs and gutters and all other things, in accordance with, and as shown in the plans and specifications for the improvement of said portions of said streets prepared by Geary Kimbrell, City Surveyor, filed with the City Recorder on the 3rd day of October, 1913, which plans and specifications are hereby particularly referred to; and be it further Resolved, that the plans and specifications and estimate for such improvement as prepared by the City Surveyor and filed with the Recorder of the City of Pendleton on the 3rd day of October, 1913, be and they are hereby approved and adopted; and be it further Resolved, that the cost of making such improvement shall be a charge and lien upon all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land, and the owners of such lots, parts of lots, and parcels of land so specially benefited by such improvement shall be liable for the payment of the costs thereof; and be it further Resolved, that an assessment district is hereby created to be known as Assessment District No. 27, embracing the property to be assessed for such improvement, which assessment district shall include all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying and being within the district bounded and described as follows:

Alta Street from the West Line of Main Street to the West Line of Chestnut Street.
Chestnut Street from the South Line of Alta Street to the North Line of Webb Street.
