CAMPAIGN ON TO PAY DEBT

CHRISTIAN CHURCH PASTOR IN SERMON ON "SQUARE DEAL"

With a sermon last evening by the pastor, Rev. T. F. Weaver, the local Christian church entered upon a campaign to raise money with which to meet the debt outstanding against the church.

In his address Rev. Weaver said in part:

Text: "And He saith unto them, whose is this image and superscription? They say unto Him, Caesar's. Then He saith unto them, Render therefore unto Caesar the things that are Caesar's; and unto God the things that are God's." Matt. 22:20, 21.

My friends, your presence on this occasion is an expression of your interest in a worthy undertaking being launched for the moral and religious welfare of the entire city and community. No man has a right to be a parasite in any community; to receive the benefits of the church or any other public organization which exists for the public good without contributing to its support. No sane man would expect to receive the benefits of the public school, the city and national government without paying them tribute for their protection. God has demanded that this should be done.

But behind every good government, behind our public schools, libraries, sanitariums, hospitals, orphanages, insane asylums, free presses, freedom of speech, and every charitable and benevolent institution, stands the church, the mightiest fortress that has ever been erected. It stands against slavery, oppression, injustice, disease, sin and death; and as the greatest promoter, the first advocate of every other movement, institution or organization which exists for the highest development of man and for his greatest happiness. You have rendered unto the government the things that are the government's. "Render, now therefore unto God the things that are God's." Give the Lord and His church a square deal.

The church (and I speak of it in a general sense) is either a bad institution or a good one. If it is a bad institution every citizen in the community ought to organize against it and use his influence with the government to wipe it out of existence. This ought to be an easy thing to do. If it is a bad thing, for we could count on all dishonest men, infidels, barlows, anarchists, drunkards, vice keepers and promoters, thieves, liars, and all the vulgar and licentious element to start with, and then if the good people would drop into line behind them we could fire or dynamite the churches, erect houses of vice, prostitution and murder in their place "for the benefit of our children?" and on election day vote it out unanimously and celebrate the occasion with a bacchanalian feast and a riot with bloodshed. You could also count on all fools and idiots for they always tag along with the crowd. Business, of course, would pick up in Pendleton, especially would the police courts, the doctors and lawyers be kept busy.

On the other hand, if the church is a good institution, it is entitled to the support of all the people. It is entitled to a square deal. I grant that it has made some mistakes on account of the Bible being withheld from the people, and because some bigots crept in, and on account of the mistake made by its union with the state in the time of Constantine when barbarians and heathen were admitted into its membership without being properly taught and regenerated but Christianity has never made a mistake. The church and Christianity are two distinct things but Christianity would never be promoted without the church notwithstanding its mistakes. The church is only a means to that end. It is the pole that upholds the Christ. The pole may have its imperfections but the Christ it upholds to the world, and its ideals advocated by Jesus are absolutely perfect. No man has ever been able to find any fault with Jesus. Pilate said, "I find no fault with this

man." Mr. Ingersoll said, "I wish I could have lived in the days of Jesus, and mingled his tears with his tears and sat at the feet of the greatest teacher humanity has ever known."

But how did Mr. Ingersoll know about that Great Teacher? It was through the Church of Christ. Men and women have stained the soil of every land with their blood in testimony of His good tidings to the world. It is the church that has provided the missionaries, and printing presses that gave us the knowledge we have of Jesus and of His wonderful teaching concerning the Fatherhood of God and the Brotherhood of man. Then give the church a square deal, and give Christ a square deal. "No man can serve two masters," said Jesus. "You cannot serve God and mammon." "He that is not for me is against me, and he that gathereth not with Me scattereth." You must line up with the class that would abolish the churches or with the people who are sacrificing to uplift the world. Let me plead with you to give Christ a square deal.
