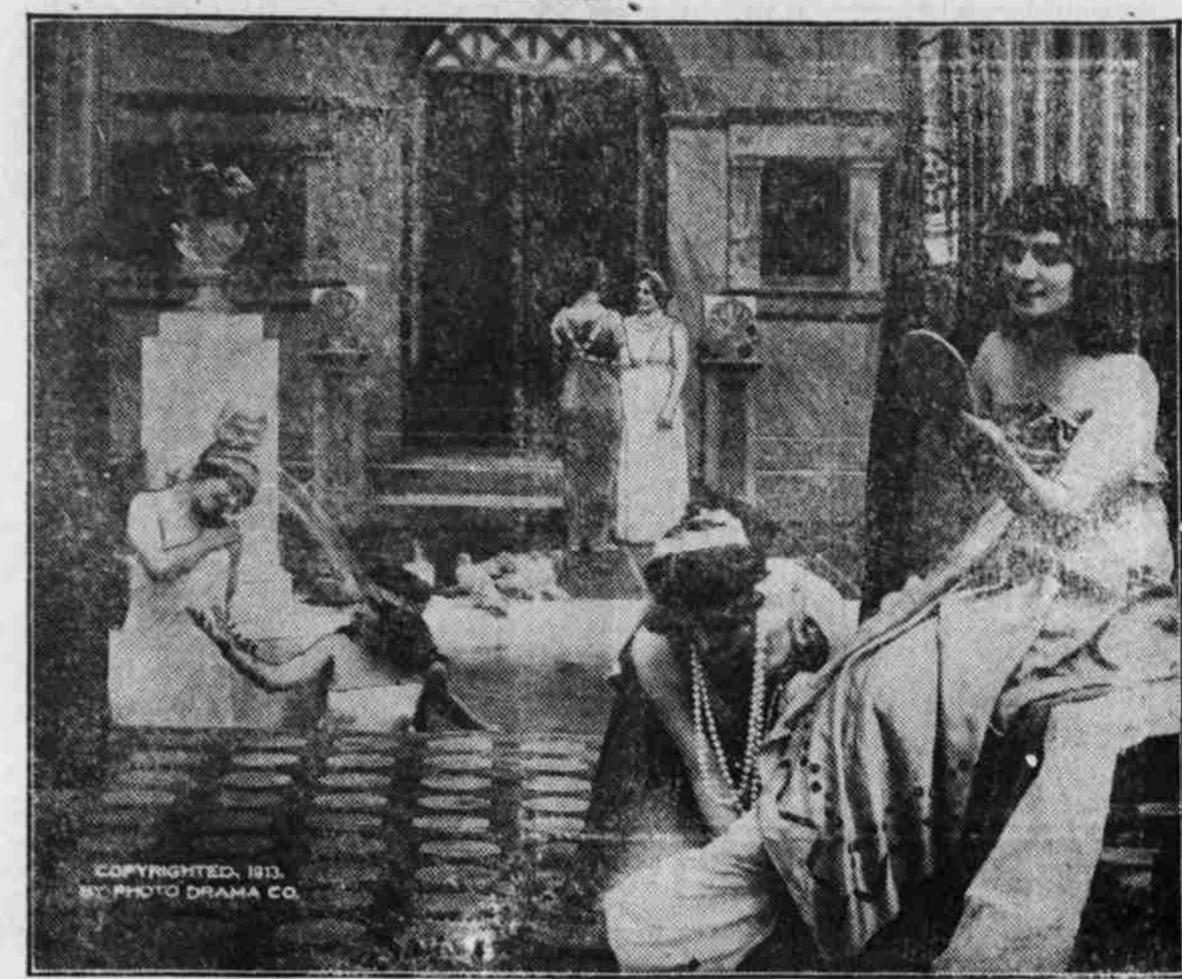
That alfalfa raising on dry land in the inland empire may be conducted with profit and should be Dry Land followed more than at Alfalfa. present is the view of the agriculturist at the state college at Pullman, Wash. A recent statement from the college contains the following about dry land alfalfa raising:

1. Areas receiving considerable runoff from higher lands or light sub-irrigation are found occasionally within the rainfall belt of five to fifteen inches that often produce two good crops amounting to three or four tons per acre, but are no guide to what may be expected with the natural rainfall. They are misleading when so taken.

2. Where the rainfall is less than 15 inches and there is no runoff or sub-irrigation, one fair to light crop annually is all that should be expected, if every precaution in the culture of the crop is observed. This is better than one fair wheat crop every four to six years.

3. With less than twelve inches rainfall, farmers are advised to experiment with small tracts until they

learn what they can do. Considerable risk is attached to establishing the crop with less than twelve inches annual rainfall.

1. Seed of the highest quality. 2. A first class summer fallow, offering a good supply of readily available plant food, stored moisture, freedom from weeds. A poor summer fallow is not safe. The young plants need every advantage.

3. No nurse crop. (Where the soil drifts a nurse crop would be necessary, but the success of alfalfa under such conditions is very doubtful.)

4. Seeding with a drill, as described in latest bulletin issued by the state college.

5. Very thin seeding, preferably in rows 30 to 42 inches apart for cultivation.

6. Thorough cultivation every year. 7. Care not to pasture close at any time.

We would strongly urge farmers throughout the semi-arid belt to give alfalfa a careful trial. As a forage and soil-improving crop for such conditions it is of the highest rank.

Bruce Dennis, good looking editor of a paper that is fast improving in appearance, the La Grande Observer, is Does La Grande Grande Observer, is Need a Keeper? aroused over the East Oregonian's criticism of the city manager plan of government adopted at La Grande.

"The East Oregonian with its usual positiveness, has labelled the La Grande form of commission government a miserable failure," says the Observer.

That is exactly what the East Oregonian did not do. What this paper did was to point out the weaknesses of the managerial plan as compared with the regular commission government plan such as is in vogue in Baker, Walla Walla, Spokane, Portland and elsewhere. This paper expressed a decided preference for the true commission plan in preference to the city manager plan. But no prediction was made as to whether the manager plan would succeed or fail in La Grande.

The city manager plan may be the very thing for La Grande. If they want a keeper over there instead of a government La Grande has acted well in adopting the manager plan.

SENSATIONAL STORY EXPECTED IN BERLIN

REVELATIONS ANTICIPATED AS RESULT OF EDITOR'S TRIAL FOR LIBEL.

BERLIN, Oct. 21.—Sensational disclosures rivaling and similar to the details of the notorious "Eulenberg round-table scandals" were predicted today when Walter Steinhilf, publisher of a local weekly went on trial here charged with criminal libel. Steinhilf, in his paper, charged that Count von Hulsen-Haesler, director general of the Kaiser's Royal Opera, is a moral pervert of the Oscar Wilde type. Count von Hulsen-Haesler is an intimate friend of Kaiser Wilhelm.

Steinhilf, besides accusing the count of being a moral pervert, declared also that one of the best known actors in Germany, who is attached to the Royal Court Theater, of which Hulsen-Haesler is one of the directors, belongs to the Wilde category and belongs to a "second round-table" with the count who today appeared against him as plaintiff. Steinhilf today naively declared that "such persons need not feel insulted or libeled as the time is past when this moral perversion is taken as a symptom of degeneracy or mental deficiency." Because of Steinhilf's repeated and calm accusations, the air is full of rumors, that his trial will bring about a public sensation of moral degeneracy in high circles second only to the Eulenberg scandal which resulted in several prisons.

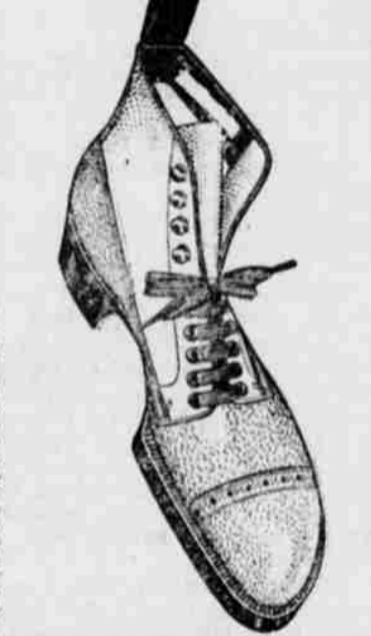
