

WHEAT CLOSES WITH ADVANCE OF 7-8THS

Chicago Market Up 7-8c for Options - Foreign Market Aided by Poor Crop Reports.

CHICAGO, Oct. 30.—Closing prices in the wheat market yesterday reflected the damage news coming from Australia and Argentina. Final figures were 7-8c a bushel higher than Tuesday for both options.

Market opened with an advance of 1-2c for December and 5-8c for May with the latter in best demand during the season.

Bradstreet's report of the grain visible supply in bushels: Wheat—East of Rockies decreased 338,000, west of Rockies decreased 650,000, Canada increased 1,542,000, Europe and Africa increased 900,000; total world's supply increased 1,454,000 bushels.

Corn, decreased 129,000 bushels. Oats, increased 1,439,000 bushels. Broomhall wheat from Liverpool that the wheat market was higher with Manitoba offerings showing a good trade at three pence advance and firm continental markets with bidding freely for cargo offers.

Later there was good speculative support with the undertone very firm. There are various cables from Argentina of an apprehensive character and the continued dryness in India and firm Russian offers were largely responsible for the advance.

October 22, 1913, the following resolutions were adopted:

Whereas, the Surveyor of the City of Pendleton did on the 22nd day of October, 1913, under direction and by requirement of the Common Council file plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of Lee Street, Court Street and Alta Street, in the City of Pendleton as follows: Lee Street from the North line of Lewis Street to the South line of Court Street, Court Street from the East line of Lewis Street to the West line of Stonewall Jackson Street and Alta Street from the South line of Court Street to the East line of the Paved Portion of said Alta Street, with Gravel Bitulithic Pavement together with the estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof,

Resolved, that the cost of making such improvement shall be a charge and lien upon all lots, parts of lots, and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and the owners of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land so benefited shall be liable for the payment of the costs thereof; and be it further

Resolved, that an assessment district is hereby created to be known as Assessment District No. 28, embracing the property to be assessed for the payment of such improvement, which district shall include all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying and being within the district bounded and described as follows:

Description of Local Improvement District No. 28. Lee Street from the North Line of Lewis Street to the South Line of Court Street.

Court Street from the East Line of Lewis Street to the West Line of Stonewall Jackson Street.

Whereas, the Surveyor of the City of Pendleton did on the 22nd day of October, 1913, under direction and by requirement of the Common Council file plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of Vincent Street, in the City of Pendleton, from the South line of Lewis Street to the North Curb Line of Court Street, with Gravel Bitulithic pavement, together with the estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, and the estimate of the cost of such work, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and the percentage of the total cost of improvement which each of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land should pay on account of the benefits to be derived from such improvement; and

Whereas, the Council has examined said plans and specifications and finds them to be satisfactory and the estimates therefor to be in accordance with the probable cost of such work, and

Whereas, the improvement of the hereinabove described portion of said Vincent Street, with gravel bitulithic pavement, is at this time necessary; therefore, be it

Resolved, by the Common Council of the City of Pendleton that it is expedient to improve, and it is hereby proposed to improve Vincent Street from the South line of Lewis Street to the North Curb line of Court Street by paving the same with gravel bitulithic pavement, such pavement to be made and laid down, and the street to have curbs, gutters, and all other things and to be improved in accordance with and as shown in the plans and specifications for the improvement of said portion of Vincent Street prepared by Geary Kimbrell, City Surveyor, and filed with the Recorder of the City of Pendleton, on the 22nd day of October, 1913, which plans and specifications are hereby particularly referred to; and be it further

Resolved, that the plans and specifications and estimates for such improvement, as prepared by the City Surveyor and filed with the Recorder of the City of Pendleton on the 22nd day of October, 1913, be and they are hereby approved and adopted; and be it further

Resolved, that the cost of making such improvement shall be a charge and lien upon all lots, parts of lots, and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and the owners of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land so benefited shall be liable for the payment of the costs thereof; and be it further

Resolved, that an assessment district is hereby created to be known as Assessment District No. 28, embracing the property to be assessed for the payment of such improvement, which district shall include all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying and being within the district bounded and described as follows:

Description of Local Improvement District No. 28. Vincent Street from the South Line of Lewis Street to the North Curb Line of Court Street.

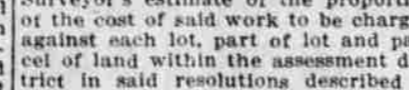
