## CLOSING WHEAT IS LOWER IN CHICAGO

Chicago Market Closes 3-8 to 1-2c a Bushel Off—Argentina Rains a Factor.

CHICAGO, Nov. 13.—Closing figures in the wheat market were 3-8 to 1-2c a bushel lower than Tuesday. Opening of the market was at a loss of 1-4 to 1-2c a bushel.

There was less strength shown abroad and the lower cables from Liverpool caused selling here at the start. According to a cable from Broomhall, the Liverpool wheat market opened steadily on continued unfavorable reports from India. Later the market showed a decline on the report from Argentina of beneficial rains in Pamapas.

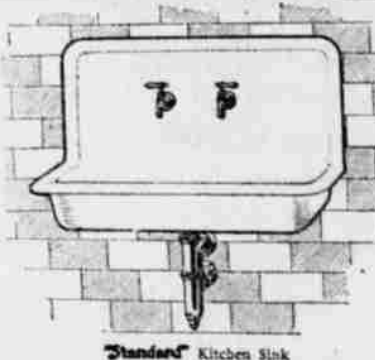
