

Kitchen Hints.

The secret of flaky pie crust is the use of hot water (not boiling) rather than cold in mixing the dough. If this hint is followed the crust will always be flaky, tender and crisp, says the Denver Times.


The addition of a little soda mixed with a teaspoonful of corn starch to the cream before pouring it into the tomato mixture, will prevent curdling in the making of creamed tomato soup.

Often when boiling eggs the white comes through the shell and spoils the taste of the egg through its appearance. This may be prevented if a teaspoonful of salt is put into the water before boiling.

No matter how much dripping is used, fish when being fried is apt to stick to the pan's bottom. If a tablespoonful of dry salt is put into the pan and rubbed over it it will be found satisfactory.
