WHEAT RECOVERS LOSS AND CLOSES HIGHER

Chicago Market Closed a Fraction Better Than Thursday After Stalling Lower.

CHICAGO, Dec. 13.—Wheat market was weaker and 1-8c to 3-8c lower at the opening, but the closing was higher by 1-8c than Thursday. The early weakness in the trade was due to the losses abroad, but the later recovery was forced by the covering of shorts and advices from Argentina telling of poorer outlook.

GENERAL CONDITION LIVESTOCK STEADY

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 13.—There was a heavy run of supplies in the local yards today, hogs and sheep showing the bulk of the offerings.

Conditions in the hog trade are fairly steady and for extreme quality sales were again reported this morning as high as \$8.
Today's general hog market range: Top killers, \$7.90 @ 8.00; good and light, 7.85 @ 7.90; heavy, 7.85 @ 7.90; rough and heavy, 6.75 @ 7.00.

Cattle Market is Weaker.
Conditions in the cattle trade are weaker with prices generally on the toboggan except for extreme quality. There were quite fair arrivals for the day and as the yards are full of prize stuff, the inclination to take hold is less favorable than formerly.

Today's general cattle range: Best steers, \$7.30 @ 8.00; ordinary steers, 7.50 @ 7.60; poor steers, 7.00 @ 7.25; Best heifers, 6.90; Best cows, 6.90; Medium cows, 6.25; Poor cows, 5.50 @ 5.65; Ordinary bulls, 4.50; Fancy stags, 6.65; Fancy bulls, 6.50; Prime light calves, 8.50 @ 9.00; Prime heavy, 6.50 @ 7.50.

Practically no change is shown in the sheep market situation at North Portland. There was a rather heavy run over night, but killers were good bidders and in general there were well established quotations. Good stuff is not neglected even in the slightest particular.
