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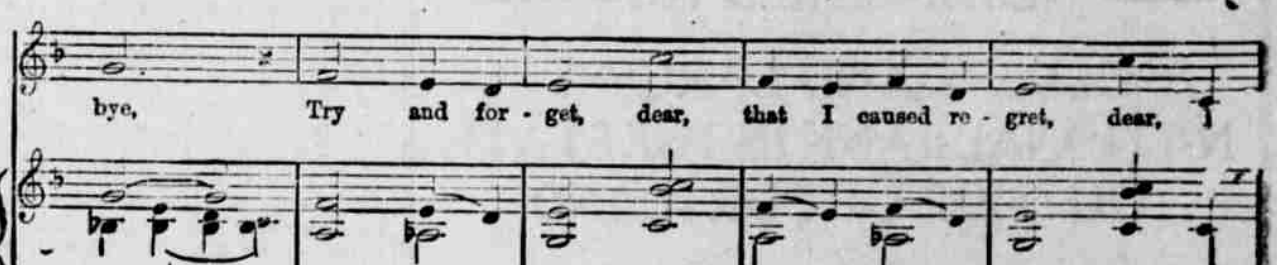

## ANOTHER VICTIM FOR THE SLAUGHTER

(From the Medford Tribune.)

The Portland Oregonian has nominated R. A. Booth of Eugene as republican candidate for United States senate to succeed George E. Chamberlain not because it is expected that Mr. Booth can be elected, but because it is expected that he can aid in the defeat of former Senator Jonathan Bourne, Jr., for the nomination.

Mr. Booth, who is a wealthy retired lumberman, has accepted the Oregonian's nomination on account of the "unsolicited endorsements" received from all over the state, and his hat is in the ring. An analysis of the campaign in Booth's behalf to date is interesting. He was shoved in the limelight by President of the Senate Dan J. Maloney, as chairman of the Oregon Pan-Pacific fair board. It was at first decided to make Booth the Oregonian machine candidate for governor—then he was switched to the senatorial class. A carefully prepared plan was outlined and followed.

Society of Agricultural Engineers

The convention will be in session two days. This afternoon's session was devoted to discussion of seed improvement, with Prof. C. E. Chase of the North Dakota Agricultural college, and Dr. H. E. Horton, an agronomist, the speakers.

Designing of farm buildings, the selection of proper implements and the use of concrete in drainage, are topics to be handled tomorrow by representatives of cement and implement companies. The annual banquet will be held tomorrow night, and the convention will end with the discussion of the growth of agriculture, education by Prof. F. M. White of the University of Wisconsin, and Prof. J. B. Davidson, of Iowa State college.

## NEW BUILDINGS FOR STATE FAIR GROUNDS.

SALEM, Ore., Dec. 30.—When the state fair holds its annual meeting here it will consider, and possibly adopt, plans for the erection of the new pavilion at the state fair grounds for which an appropriation was made by the last legislature. Originally it was the plan to construct this building so that it would be ready for use at the last fair, but brick was not available early in the building season, and it had to be abandoned. Plenty of brick will be available from the penitentiary, however, in the spring and the building can be completed in ample time for the next fair. The board at this meeting will also elect officers.

## MAIL CLERKS USE SKATES.

Rollers Donned to Expedite Work of Men on Concrete Floor.

CHICAGO, Dec. 31.—Roller skates were brought into use in the post-office here to accelerate the movements of clerks in the checking room.
