### WHEAT CLOSES HIGHER

Chicago Market Rises One Half Cent a Bushel—World's Market Up.

CHICAGO, Jan. 13.—Closing prices for wheat options were 1-2c a bushel higher, with opening values up 3-8c. There was a firmer tone generally in the world's trade for the day and this forced short covering at the start.

Broomhall cabled from Liverpool that the wheat market opened higher on steadier American cables and firmness in Buenos Ayres. Later there was further evidence of speculative support.

There was an erratic tone for hogs today even though the run over Sunday was exceedingly heavy. Total arrivals were 2935 head compared with 2117 a week ago, 1134 a year ago and 804 head this same day two years ago. During the morning the general trend of the trade was weak with a loss of a dime in the price but some stuff sold a nickel better than Saturday at \$8.95 and it was reported that a nickel above this had been offered for one load.

### FRIEND OF CANADIAN INDIANS DIES AT 81

OTTAWA, Ont., Jan. 13.—David Laird, Indian Commissioner, former minister of the interior and first governor of Northwest Territory, died here, aged 81 years.

Laird was the owner of the Charlottetown Patriot, and an active journalist when he entered public life in 1853 as a delegate to Ottawa to conclude negotiations for the entrance of Prince Edwards Island into the Dominion of Canada. On the consummation of that event, he was chosen minister of the interior.

Since 1878, he had devoted his energies largely to the relations between the government and Indians, among whom he established a reputation for integrity, sympathy and fair judgment. Practically all the Indian tribes in the Dominion called him "The Big Chief." He was the author of a book on "Our Indian Treaties."
