

MORE OREGON FARMERS IS DEMAND OF STATE

LARGE AREAS OF TILLABLE LANDS OFFER GOOD HOMES TO COLONISTS.

"It is not too much to believe that the state will double the number of its farmers within the next five years," says Professor H. D. Scudder, agricultural college agronomist, in the "Oregon Farmer." "The extremely small numbers of farms and the large size of most of them show what the state has to offer an increased farming population."

There are nearly 24,000,000 acres of tillable land and only about 45,000 farms in Oregon. About eighty per cent of the tillable land is not cultivated. A comparison of the number of farms in the Willamette with the number in other parts of the state will show where the land has been most fully occupied and where the land has been most fully occupied and where the greatest development is still to take place. In most cases in all regions, the farms are twice as large as desirable for the most profitable production. This fact taken in connection with a large amount of tillable land still uncultivated accounts for the low prices of land in all parts of the state, even while there is an increased valuation shown.

"With these facts in mind it hardly seems too much for anyone to say that there is opportunity in Oregon for five or even ten times its present farming population with prosperity for all greater than the farmers now enjoy. With the continued westward trend of the farming population of our country, with the added influx through the canal and with Oregon on the very shores of the Pacific, it is not too much to believe that the farming population will make a rapid increase."

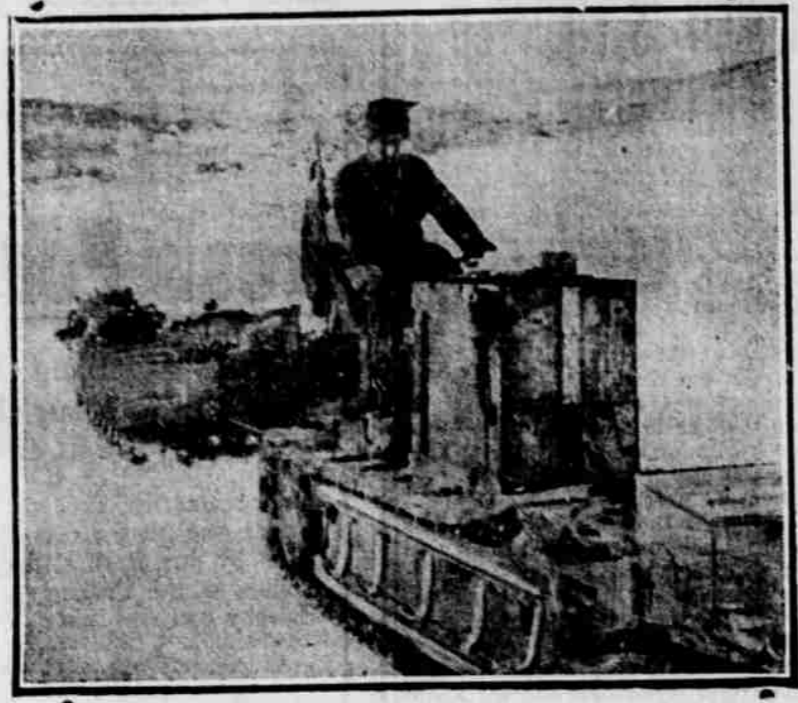
