

WHEAT CHANGE SMALL

Chicago Market is Unchanged for May and 1-8 Up for July and Start and Closing.

CHICAGO, Feb. 21.—Only fractional changes were shown in the wheat market at the closing yesterday. May being unchanged and July 1-8c better than Thursday's final. Opening figures were unchanged for May and 1-8c up for July.

After the opening the market showed a rise of 1-4c for May and but 1-8 for July. The weakness at the opening was due to the unfavorable start of the Liverpool market, although the closing there was higher.

Broomhall cabled from Liverpool that the larger shipments from Argentina caused some pressure at the opening, with liberal exports from Australia expectations of larger world's shipments this week. Later there was covering and speculative support induced by fewer Manitoba offers, firmness in spot improved millers demand and firmness of Australian offers.

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 21.—By a drop in prices in the east and a further strengthening of quotations here North Portland today became the highest priced hog market in the entire country. Hogs sold here at \$8.75 for tops this morning, while the best price available in the east was not above \$8.70.
