NEW TYPE OF ENGINE DEVELOPS OWN GASOLINE

OAKLAND, Ore., March 14.—The first boat built on the Pacific Coast to be equipped with Diesel engines has been launched from the Oakland shipyards of D. J. Hanlon.

The boat is the Marie L. Hanlon, 75 feet in length and fitted to accommodate 100 passengers. She is of 160 horsepower, turning 225 revolutions a minute. The first, and so far the only vessel with Diesel engines to visit the Pacific coast was the Siam, which recently took a cargo of freight from Oakland for the Orient. She attracted much attention from steamship men, her new type of engines, which develop their own gasoline from crude oil, being a brand new development in sea going craft, and having enormous power, while occupying but a small percentage of the space required by steam engines.

SURVEY OF UMATILLA WILL BE MADE SOON

ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF INTERIOR REPLIES TO PENDLETON REQUEST.

WASHINGTON, March 14.—The following letter from the assistant secretary of interior, relating to topographic surveys of the Umatilla river and its tributaries, has been received by Senator Chamberlain: "In reply to your memorandum of February 23, including a letter from C. K. Cranston, secretary Commercial association, Pendleton, Ore., with copy of resolutions adopted by that body requesting topographic and hydrographic surveys of the Umatilla river and its tributaries and that the topographic surveys include the entire watershed of the Umatilla river and its tributaries:

"I have the honor to state that all funds available for field work during the present fiscal year have been allotted to specific areas and that it is impossible to anticipate the new appropriations to be made by congress to the extent of making any definite promise as to what surveys may be made with such funds. "The greater portion of the annual allotment for topographic surveys in Oregon is apportioned between surveys in national forests and those in cooperation with the state, and under this plan specific areas to be mapped are selected in conference between representatives of the geological survey and the other interested parties. Current requests for topographic surveys include the mapping of the Pendleton quadrangle, which lies immediately east of the Umatilla, and the Gibbon quadrangle, east of the Pendleton. "While almost one-half of the Gibbon quadrangle lies within the Wenaha national forest, the forest service, in view of the limited appropriation, has considered other areas of more importance and requested that surveys be taken up elsewhere. The state engineer having in mind cooperation with the reclamation service has also requested topographic surveys in the vicinity of the towns of Condon and Fossil, in eastern Oregon, and these have proceeded in a systematic manner in order that data may be available as early as possible to be used in connection with the investigation and utilization of the waters of the John Day river. "The geological survey is now main-

taining, in cooperation with the state engineer of Oregon, gauging station on the Umatilla river near Umatilla and Yakum, and on the north fork of the Umatilla river near Gibbon. Other stream flow records have been collected by the survey in the basin as follows: Umatilla river at Gibbon, 1898-1911; Umatilla river at Pendleton, 1891-1892, 1903-1905; McKay creek near Pendleton, 1903-1904. "I realize fully the importance of the request made by the Pendleton Commercial association and since a copy of the resolution has been transmitted to both the secretary of agriculture and the state engineer of Oregon, the requests contained therein will be carefully considered when making plans for the next season, with the hope that funds may be available for the commencement of this work.

SPECIAL ELECTION CALLED.

The following is the full text of the amendment:

Be It Enacted by the People of the City of Pendleton:

The People of The City of Pendleton do Ordain as Follows:

That the Charter of The City of Pendleton, Umatilla County, Oregon, shall be amended by adding thereto a section to be numbered Section 1 B, to read as follows:

Section 1 B. That whenever an assessment for the opening, altering, grading, paving or improving of any street, or the construction, reconstruction or repair of any sewer or for any kind of local improvement which has been or may hereafter be made by the City, has been or shall hereafter be set aside, annulled, declared or rendered void, or its enforcement refused by any court of this state, or any Federal court, having jurisdiction therein, whether directly or by virtue of any decision of such court, or when the council shall be in doubt as to the validity of such assessment, or any part thereof, the council may, by ordinance, make a new assessment, or re-assessment, upon the lots, blocks or parcels of land which have been benefited by such improvement to the extent of their respective and proportionate shares of the full value thereof. Such re-assessment shall be based upon the special and peculiar benefit of such improvement to the property of land assessed, at the time of its original making, but shall not exceed the amount of such original assessment. Interest thereon from the date of delinquency of the original assessment may be added at the discretion of the Council. Such re-assessment shall be made in an equitable manner, as nearly as may be in accordance with the law in force at the time it is made; but the Council may adopt a different plan of apportionment of benefits, when in its judgment essential, to secure an equitable re-assessment. The proceedings required by this Charter to be had prior to the making of the original assessment shall not be required to be taken or had within the intent of this section. Such re-assessment shall be made and shall become a charge upon the property upon which the same is laid, notwithstanding the omission, failure or neglect of any officer, body or person to comply with the provisions of this Charter connected with or relating to such improvement and original assessment and notwithstanding the proceedings of the Council or of any officer, contractor or other person connected with such work or improvement may have been irregular or defective, whether such irregularity or defect be jurisdictional or otherwise. Such re-assessment shall not be made in case of a street improvement wherein a remonstrance sufficient in law to defeat the original improvement shall have been filed. The Council shall by resolution declare the district that has been or will be benefited by the improvement to be assessed, and shall direct the Recorder or City Engineer to prepare a preliminary re-assessment upon the property included therein within a time to be fixed by said resolution. Upon the passage of such resolution the Recorder shall, as soon thereafter as such re-assessment is prepared, give notice by ten successive publications in some daily newspaper published in The City of Pendleton, that such re-assessment is on file in his office, giving the date of the passage of the resolution directing the making of the same and the time at which the Council will hear and consider objections to said re-assessment by parties aggrieved thereby; and warning such persons not to depart until such re-assessment has been completed. The Recorder shall have power to direct the owner of each lot or part thereof, or tract of land, affected by such re-assessment, or to his agent, of the postoffice address of either be known to the Recorder, a notice of such re-assessment, and if such postoffice address be unknown, then such notice shall be directed to such owner or agent at Pendleton, Oregon. The owner or owners of any property which is assessed on such re-assessment, or any person having an interest therein, may within ten days from the last publication herein provided, file with the Recorder his objections in writing to such re-assessment. At the time appointed in such notice the Council shall hear and determine all objections which have been filed by any party interested. The Council shall have power to adjourn such hearing from time to time and shall have the power, in its discretion, to revise and correct, or to set aside and order the remaking of such re-assessment, and shall pass an ordinance approving and confirming such re-assessment as corrected and remade by it, and such decision shall be a final determination of the regularity, validity and correctness of the re-assessment, except as hereinafter otherwise provided. When said re-assessment is completed and confirmed it shall be entered in the Docket of City Liens and shall be enforced and collected in the same manner that other assessments for local improvements are enforced and collected under this Charter and the laws governing the city. All sums paid upon the former assessment shall be credited to the property on account of which the same were

Catarrh Causes Many Diseases.

If he loses his hearing to the extent that he can only hear the tick of his watch two feet from the ear he may not suspect it at all. His hearing is good enough for ordinary purposes. He goes on without the slightest suspicion that he is losing his hearing. He may have ringing in the ear, or cracking and snapping sounds in the ear, or a feeling of pressure in the ear, but he is not aware that he is losing his hearing.

Testing the Hearing.

It is a good thing to test your hearing with a watch. First hold the watch against your ear, then move it gradually away from the ear and see how far away from the watch you can actually hear it tick. Try it on the other side and see if both ears are alike. If you find that you are unable to hear the watch on both sides alike and at a distance of four feet from the ear, you may know that deafness has already begun.
