

SPANIARDS MUST GO SAY REBEL LEADERS

VILLA AND CARRANZA AGREE
THOROUGHLY IN EXPULSION
OF DON.

JUAREZ, Mex. April 8.—Despite expressions of Washington's unofficial displeasure at the expulsion of the Spanish colony from Torreon, the purpose of the rebel leaders in this regard was unshaken.

It is learned from an authoritative rebel source that General Carranza and General Villa are in thorough accord on the subject and that the Spanish subjects throughout the republic as fast as other states may fall into constitutional hands will be treated exactly as at Torreon and Chihuahua.

George C. Carothera, vice consul, is known to have had an interview with General Carranza on the Spanish question.

It was said that Consul Carothera informed Carranza the expulsion of the Spanish residents was viewed gravely at Madrid and without favor at Washington. The general replied that evidence of Spanish conspiracy against the revolution was over whelming in all parts of the country, and that their expulsion was not only just but the part of wisdom.

TWO MORE REGIONAL BANKS DEMANDED FOR THE WEST

GOVERNORS IN SESSION AT DENVER UNANIMOUSLY FAVOR PROPOSAL.

DENVER, April 8.—Governors of seven states, delegates to the western governors' conference in session here, went on record yesterday with a demand on congress for the establishment of two more regional reserve banks—one in the Pacific northwest and the other in the Rocky mountain states.

The action was taken on motion of Governor Ernest Lister of Washington, and was concurred in by Governors Tasker L. Oddie, Nevada; Joseph M. Carey, Wyoming; Oswald West, Oregon; John M. Haines, Idaho; Will Iham Spry, Utah, and E. M. Ammons, Colorado. Governors Lister, West and Haines were appointed a committee to draft resolutions in conformity with the motion as passed.

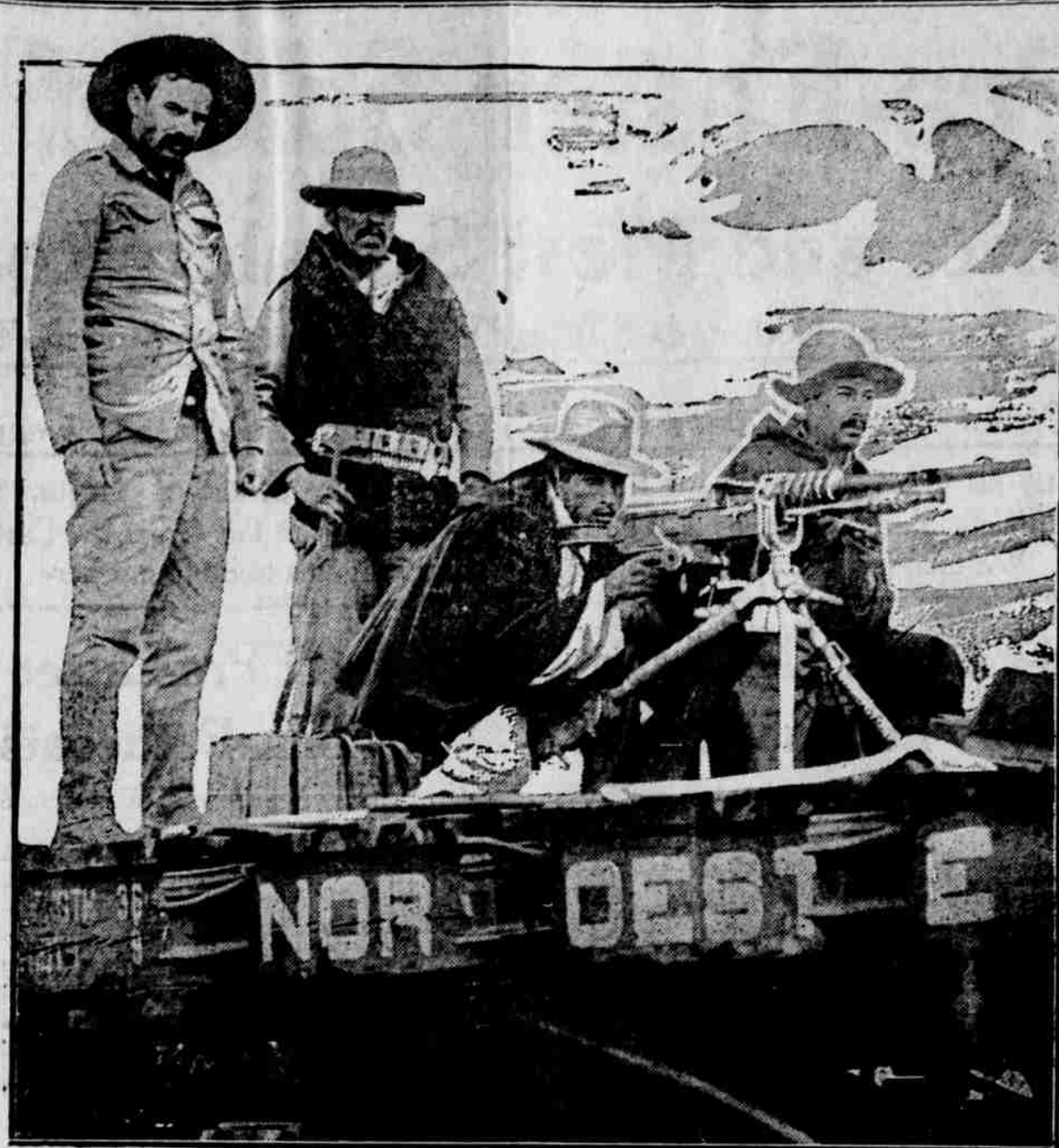

REPRIEVE IS DENIED CONVICTED GUNMEN

GOVERNOR GLYNN REFUSES TO INTERFERE WITH CARRYING OUT SENTENCES.

ALBANY, N. Y., April 8.—Governor Glynn refused to commute the death sentence of the four gunmen convicted of killing Herman Rosenthal, the New York gambler until after the second trial of ex-Police Lieutenant Becker. They must die by electrocution some time next week, probably Monday.

The court of appeals in denying their motion for a new trial set the week of April 13 as the time for their execution. The exact date is fixed by the warden of Sing Sing prison. The full names and nicknames of the condemned men are: Frank Cl-

rofici ("Dago Frank"), Harry Horowitz ("Gyp the Blood"), Louis Rosenberg ("Lefty Louis") and Jacob Seldenshiner ("Whitey Lewis").

BIG BERLIN FIRM BANKRUPT.

Wertheim & Co., Described by "Princes Trust" in Hart Straits.

BERLIN, April 8.—Bankruptcy proceedings were opened here against the firm of W. Wertheim & Co., whose liabilities amount to about \$6,000,000.

The difficulties of the concern began when the "Princes Trust" ceased financing the undertaking. The Princes themselves have been reported in difficulties.

The Wertheim firm operated three department stores in Berlin. The assets of the firm are said in newspaper reports to be only \$715,000.

MORE INDICTMENTS RETURNED AGAINST SIEGEL AND VOGEL

NEW YORK, April 8.—Eleven new indictments have been returned against Henry Siegel and Frank Vogel principal stockholders of the Siegel stores corporation. The indictments charge that large sums of money were obtained from banks by Siegel and Vogel by means of fraudulent written statements of the financial condition of their enterprises. It was said the firm obtained two and a half million dollars last year.

LIABILITY CASE INTERPRETED IN SUPREME COURT RULING

SALEM, Ore., April 7.—Two important features of the employers' liability law were interpreted by the supreme court in affirming the verdict of the lower court awarding J. P. McLaugherty \$122,500 damages against the Rogue River Electric company for the death of his son, who was killed while working as a lineman. The court held there is no limit to the amount of damages that may be awarded under the employers' liability law by attempting other means for providing for the safety of the employees when the statute prescribed what shall be done.
