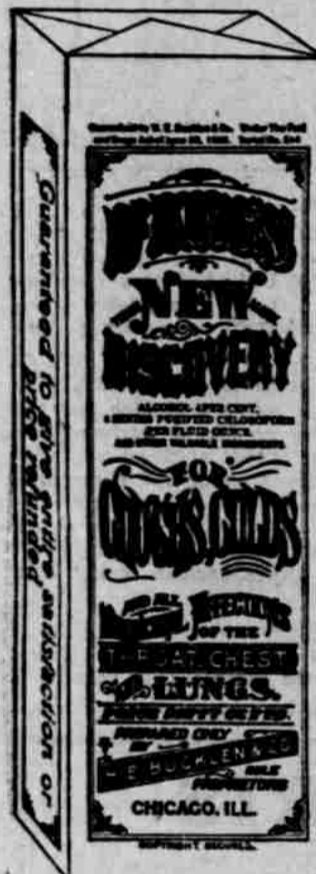

ST. HELENS, Ore., April 21.—Secret watchers were placed in lumber camps of Columbia county by Deputy Sheriff Lake, who is making every effort to capture the man or men responsible for the destruction of the Gilmore home by dynamite Friday night.

A close scrutiny of the movements of all suspects will be maintained by Deputy Sheriff Lake and his men. Bloodhounds were again unable to lend any assistance in solving the mys-

tery, and the dogs were returned to Clatskanie.

Deputy Lake believes the dynamite plot was the work of discharged workmen.
