### DIFFERENT JUSTICE FOR RICH AND POOR IN BELGIUM

BRUSSELS, May 16.—The glaring contrast in the different brands of justice handed out to the rich and poor in Belgium is being severely denounced by the labor press, the following being among the many recent instances cited.

In the local prison a rich banker is awaiting trial for having shot two workmen. A few days ago he petitioned the minister of justice to be allowed to see his dying child, and the request was promptly granted. In the same prison was a workman charged with the theft of a fireplace decoration. When he petitioned to be allowed to visit his dying mother, whose home was situated only a few yards from the prison, the request was refused. The poor woman died alone, and two days later the son was acquitted.

##### To Take Out Oil.

To clean a vessel that has contained kerosene oil, wash the vessel with thin milk of lime, which forms an emulsion with the petroleum and removes all traces of it, says the San Jose Times Star. By washing a second time with milk of lime and a very small quantity of chloride of lime, and allowing the liquid to remain in the vessel about an hour, and then washing it with cold water, the smell may be removed. If the milk of lime be used warm instead of cold, the operation is rendered much shorter.

##### Keep Heat In.

"Fireplaces," says a woman architect, "should not all be placed on outside walls. They should be placed on the inside walls, and grouped together, for this arrangement keeps the heat in the house and provides that when one fire is lighted and the flames get warmed the other fires all light and draw better."—New York Press.

##### Rooster Day in Kentucky.

WASHINGTON, May 16.—The Little Red Rooster is persona non grata with poultry experts of the department of agriculture and acting on the suggestion of the department of agriculture was named "rooster day" throughout Kentucky. The program from today on and for several months during which season the egg market is most plentiful, Kentucky poultrymen have banded together and agreed to sell only roosters for food instead of hens and chickens so that the egg crop may thereby remain unimpaired through the slaughter of hens for food as heretofore.

#### FILM COMPANY SUED FOR ATTACK ON DOCTORS

BERLIN, May 12.—On the ground that it tended to destroy public confidence in physicians, Herr von Jagow, president of the Berlin police, recently prohibited the production of a moving picture drama entitled "The Slave of a Woman." The film told a picture story of a doctor infatuated with a woman and in the course of the drama, persuades a titled woman to submit to an unnecessary operation which he declares will also save her life, in order to get money for his paramour.

The film concern appealed from the order of the police. The upper court has just rendered a decision upholding the action of the head of police. The court declared that it was not in the interest of public order and welfare that confidence in physicians should not be shaken; that the film, in question, undoubtedly tended to do this and that it was the duty of the authorities to prevent such attacks upon the medical profession.

#### WATER TRAFFIC IS NOW PASSING THROUGH CANAL

WASHINGTON, May 16.—According to reports received at headquarters of the Panama railway in New York forwarded here, water borne traffic now is passing through the Panama canal for the first time in the world's history.

#### Norwegians Celebrate.

ST. PAUL, May 16.—With oratory, music and pageantry, Norwegians of the northwest began the celebration of the one hundredth anniversary of independence of their mother country. The state fair grounds was turned over to the Norwegians and from a rostrum erected in front of the gigantic grand stand, the best orators and singers were heard by thousands. A grand pageant representing the various stages in the development of Norway and her present position among the nations was the principal event today.

#### Children in Greek Pageant.

WASHINGTON, May 16.—Twelve hundred school children will participate in "The Fire Rekindled," a Greek pageant which opens for a week here. The drama is given under the auspices of Washington business organizations, and the school children have been rehearsing for about six weeks.
