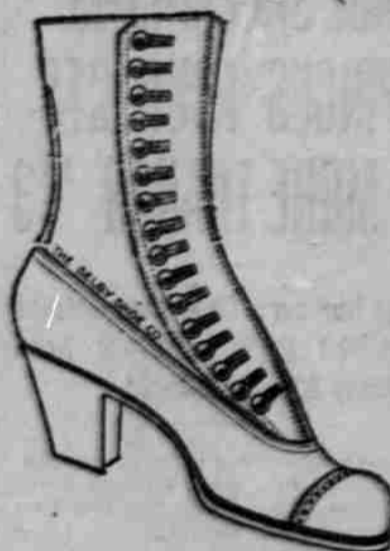

TEAL AND JACKSON APPOINTED BY WEST

Will Represent Oregon on Commission of Five to Study and Report on Highways for River Business. SALEM, Ore., May 21.—Gov. West appointed J. N. Teal and C. S. Jackson of Portland to represent Oregon on a commission of five, two other members being from Washington and one from Idaho, which was authorized at the recent meeting of the Columbia and Snake River waterways association, for the purpose of looking should be brought down to the river, over which traffic may pass for steamers on this line, and also to select or designate proper and suitable ground for wharves on which that commerce may be placed to be transferred to the boats on the river.
