HEALTH OFFICER CALLED IN TO DECIDE DISEASE.

FREEWATER, Or., June 8.—About ten days ago the little daughter of Josh Weaver who lives at the corner of Ward and Robins street in this city, was taken ill, the illness being marked by a suspicious eruption. Dr. Vanderpool of this city was called and pronounced the case smallpox, and ordered the house quarantined. The family were dissatisfied with the diagnosis and called in Dr. Gowen of Milton who stated that the child had chickenpox instead of smallpox. Dr. Vanderpool called in Dr. Thomas of Milton, who immediately verified the original diagnosis, stating that it was a well-developed case of smallpox. Not to be outdone, Dr. Gowen imported two Walla Walla physicians who backed him up in his contention that the child was suffering from the milder disease.
