The May report of the Umatilla County Public Library as submitted to the Library Board at its last meeting contains several items that will be of interest to the community.

Extension of library hours to include the noon period has proved quite worth while. Business men and women who spend the noon hour downtown are finding this a pleasant spot for reading during their leisure time.

During March, April and May of this year, 935 new books have been added to the shelves as compared with 599 volumes added during the entire year of 1913.

The new books while in Pendleton, are being kept together on shelves marked "new books" so that readers may become quickly acquainted with the added resources.

Four branch libraries have been opened during May in Pilot Rock, Vincent School, Stanfield and Echo. Pilot Rock branch is in the Commercial club room and is open all day. Vincent school library has been given summer quarters in the manual training room of the school which has been comfortably fixed up for a reading room and will be open Sunday afternoons for circulation of books. Doors are open immediately after church is out. When school is in session, books will be accessible every day. The manual training boys made the book shelves and Mr. Sevy, the principal, offers their services in making packing boxes for the shipment of books around the county. Stanfield has been given a room next to the telephone office and the hours will be from 12 to 4 and from 6 to 9 every day. At Echo, an attractive room has been fitted up by the Gelvin brothers in their office next to the post office. The library will be open two after-
