Home Hints and Recipes

For Panama Hats.

A Panama hat is a delightful accessory to one's wardrobe. It may be cleaned or bleached repeatedly. A teaspoonful of oxalic acid to a pint of lukewarm water will safely clean a Panama, leghorn, milan and other light straw hats. Apply to the hat with a soft brush or sponge. Clean only a small portion at a time, and then rub off as much moisture as possible with a clean white cloth, as in this way there will be less tendency in the hat losing its shape. Go over the entire hat carefully, and when partly dry press with a moderately hot iron over a muslin cloth. Lemon juice may be used instead of the oxalic acid with good results.

To renew a black straw hat, sponge with alcohol and then brush it over with a thin solution of, faint green, which gives a varnished finish as well as a slight stiffness. If the straw is very dingy, use a good black ink or a liquid shoe dressing before applying the gum arabic.

Dust Proof Vels.

The desire for bright colors is included in the new vels in lovely shades of violet, gray, green, taupe, tan, purple and blue. These are most charming shaded vels of chiffon and a marquisette-like fabric, which shades from a light blue to deep tones of the same color at each end. Flesh color over the face, shading to deep rose red at the ends, is a becoming shading. Pale lavender shading by degrees into deepest purple of a royal tint is another lovely veil. Then there are pale yellows shading to rich orange, faint greens to dark green and many others.

The new all-over patterns on vels are on exceptionally sheer fine meshes. The designs are delicate in character and scroll-like or trailing in effect, accomplished by means of a woven or hand-run thread combined with dainty leaves and flowers. Borders are narrow and very fine in effect.

Little silk auto caps made in a soft style to be put down over the head, have the plain colored and shaded vels run through the turnover rims and designed to be crossed in back and brought front to tie under the chin or ear.

Government Camp School Closes.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., July 21.—After six days of life in the open air, 150 students who have been attending the course of instruction in the war department's military camp here struck tents today. The term opened June 26th. Most of the boys were "freaks" when they started. They came from a dozen schools and colleges in the west. The camp of instruction was conducted under the plan of Secretary of War Garrison to instruct young men in all branches of war and especially in field campaigning. Regular army officers were in charge of the camp.

MOTHS BY MILLIONS SEEN.

Bandons Turns Over City of Insects Which Hates All Painting. BANDON, Ore., July 26.—Millions of moths have appeared in Bandon during the past week and have practically taken the city. Merchants cannot keep their display and window lights going because of the great swarms of the insects that congregate around the light spots.

Store and house painting all over the city has ceased because the fresh paints acts like fly-paper, and the owner of the freshly-painted building has to hire a cheap boy to pick the bugs off from his building every morning. The moths, which are about four times as large as the ordinary house fly and brown in color, appear to live only one day, and every morning thousands of them are found on the sidewalks and streets wherever a bright light burns at night.

Washes for Family 50 Years.

ATCHISON, Kas., July 30.—Atchison folks believe their town should be given credit for having the world's most reliable washerwoman, and they produce the record of Mrs. T. H. Bailey to back their assertions. When Mrs. Bailey took down the family washing from the clothesline at the home of G. B. Buck she completed her fiftieth consecutive year as the Buck family washerwoman. It is believed a better record for faithfulness is unrecorded in the annals of washerwomen.

BRITISH NAVY IS READY FOR ACTION

LONDON, July 31.—The British navy is prepared for war at a moment's notice and the British army is quietly and swiftly preparing. The war office throws cold water on the word "mobilization" and has issued another carefully framed notice to the newspapers that only "the usual precautions" are being taken. Nevertheless, every step necessary to place the land forces on a war footing except the summoning of the territorial arms, has been taken. All the territorial officers received orders to be prepared for a call to duty.

Territorial Engineers Put to Work. A large section of the engineers' staff of the territorial has been ordered on duty. It consists of electricians, minklayers, bridgebuilders and searchlight and lighthouse experts. Some of these forces are being sent to Ireland to replace the engineers of the regular army, all of whom have been withdrawn from that place for duty in connection with the land defenses, particularly on the eastern coast.

Every officer and private of the regular establishment on leave has been recalled: the only reason for absence accepted is serious illness. All the police, some of them to replace the soldiers guarding the military stores and stations, who are needed elsewhere.

"Humphreys' Clock" Is Sold.

LONDON, England, July 29.—"Master Humphreys' clock," the timepiece made famous by Dickens, was sold to a New York dealer by an auctioneer, with whom it had been placed. It is a grandfather clock inscribed with the name of the maker, William Humphreys of Barnard Castle, and dated 1829. The case is of Dutch lacquer, with architectural top and dial of brass and silvered metal. The real interest lies in the fact that it attracted the attention of Dickens during the six weeks the novelist spent in the Kings Head Inn at Barnard Castle working on the Dombey and Son part of "Nicholas Nickleby." The clock then stood in Humphreys' shop opposite the inn.

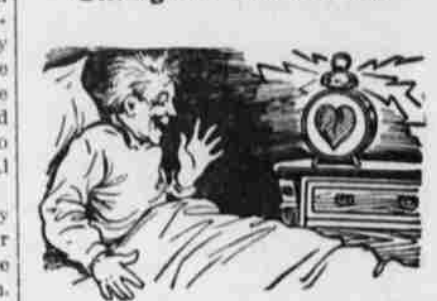

CHICAGO, July 30.—Mumps nearly caused a change in the order entered six weeks ago by Judge O'Connor of the superior court, disposing of the custody of Katherine Condict, the 14 year old daughter of Wallace Condict and Mrs. Katherine Condict, who were divorced. According to that order Katherine was to spend half of the summer with one parent and half with the other. The first half of the vacation was spent with Mr. Condict, and she was to have gone to her mother this week. She was stricken with mumps.

The court was called upon to decide what to do. He turned to the doctor in charge of the case to find out whether the child safely could leave the house and go to her mother. No final action was taken, however, and it was left to counsel on both sides.
