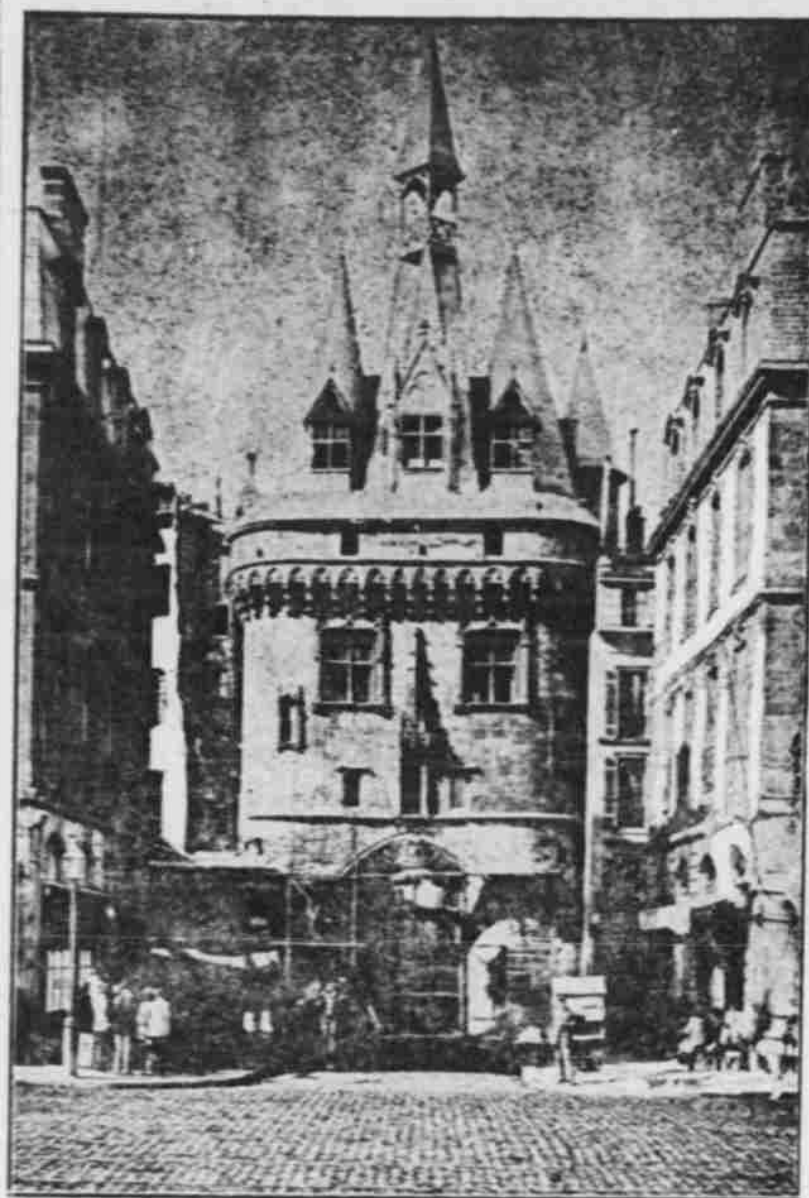

### Home Hints and Recipes

Concerning Women.

### Herb Uses.

Mint, for meat sauces. Aniseed, for flavoring cakes. Lavender, for oil and distilled water.

Sage, for sausage and meat dressings. Sweet fennel leaves used in fish soups.

Thyme, in gravies and dressings of stuffed meats. Chives, leaves used for flavoring soups and salads.

Horseradish, balm and catnip are useful where one has been. Tarragon leaves useful in giving flavor to vinegar and pickles.

Coriander, fennel and caraway seeds are used for flavoring fruit syrups and cakes.

Among those having medicinal value are arnica, hops, catnip, bane, pennyroyal, belladonna, sage, rue, horseradish, marshmallow, wormwood, hyssop and peppermint.

To Adjust a Veil.

To adjust a face veil properly so it won't slip off the hat and at the same time not have that "drawn tight" look one so often sees gather the top edge (with thread the same color as the veil), beginning about ten or twelve inches from the end, and continue until the same distance from the other end.

Rest Spots.

War Kindles Religion.

LONDON, Oct. 5.—"One result of the war has been a distinct religious revival in France," says the Paris correspondent of the Times. The dispatch continues:
