14 TO 0 IS FINAL SCORE—THRILLING 60 YARD RUN IS FEATURE. BOISE, Idaho, Nov. 21.—The Baker high school football team, which defeated the Pendleton high team 13 to 0 a week ago, yesterday triumphed over Boise high in this city, 14 to 0. A thrilling 60-yard run by Fleetwood, Baker's spectacular quarterback, gave a touchdown to the Baker champions in the first quarter of the game. Fleetwood then kicked goal, giving Baker seven points. The score at the end of the first quarter was Baker 7, Boise 0. Baker presented a stiff defense against Boise and showed superior teamwork and better offensive. The second quarter was scoreless, the half ending 7 to 0 for Baker. It was a punting duel with poorly executed forward passes featuring the formation plays. Baker scored a touchdown on a straight football in the third quarter and kicked goal from a hard angle. Score, Baker 14, Boise 0. The fourth quarter was scoreless. Boise's team was counted as a strong organization than has gone on the field for this city this year. Coach Worthine has done wonders with the team in the few weeks he has had them and from the outset Boise's play was marked by a snap and dash which has not characterized former games.

TURKS STIRRING UP UNREST IN TRIPOLI

ROME, Nov. 18.—Apparently the situation in Tripoli has suddenly become serious, due primarily to the activity of Islamic agents endeavoring to stir up the tribes there against Italy. This development in the Tripolitan situation is being watched closely here, and it is not unlikely that the Turkish propaganda in Tripoli may finally be the means of drawing Italy into the war. The first detachment of 500 troops from the garrisons of Eritrea arrived here en route for Tripoli, where they will be used to strengthen the Italian garrisons. Arrangements have been made to strengthen all the garrisons of Tripoli materially. It is announced, too, that punitive expeditions have been sent into the interior, where the situation is threatening, due to the Islamic agitation fomented by Turkey and especially by personal agents of Enver Pasha, whose influence is great. It is said that the rebellious tribes have recently been supplied with arms, ammunition and money distributed from some point across the Egyptian frontier from whence regular organized caravans are proceeding daily towards Derna.

TAMPA, Fla., Nov. 21.—Ten inmates of the state reformatory school at Marianna, Fla., are reported to have lost their lives in a fire which destroyed the institution.

Eastern Cold Wave Ends.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 21.—The cold wave which spread over the southern states forcing the mercury below the freezing point and extending north to the Middle Atlantic states, had spent its force and, according to forecasters at the weather bureau, a reaction with quick effect is bringing higher temperatures.

Reports from Atlanta showed a temperature of 24 degrees prevailing there. At Jacksonville, Fla., it was 34; at Mobile 40; Chattanooga 24; Memphis 34; and Charlotte, N. C., 28.

From northern Virginia to New England nearly normal November temperatures will prevail.

Valuable Horses Burned.

ATLANTA, Ga., Nov. 21.—The F. L. Dodge racing stables were destroyed by fire. The loss is estimated at \$150,000. Fifteen valuable trotting horses were burned to death.
