Marvin Evans, prominent attorney of Walla Walla, is looking after court matters here today.

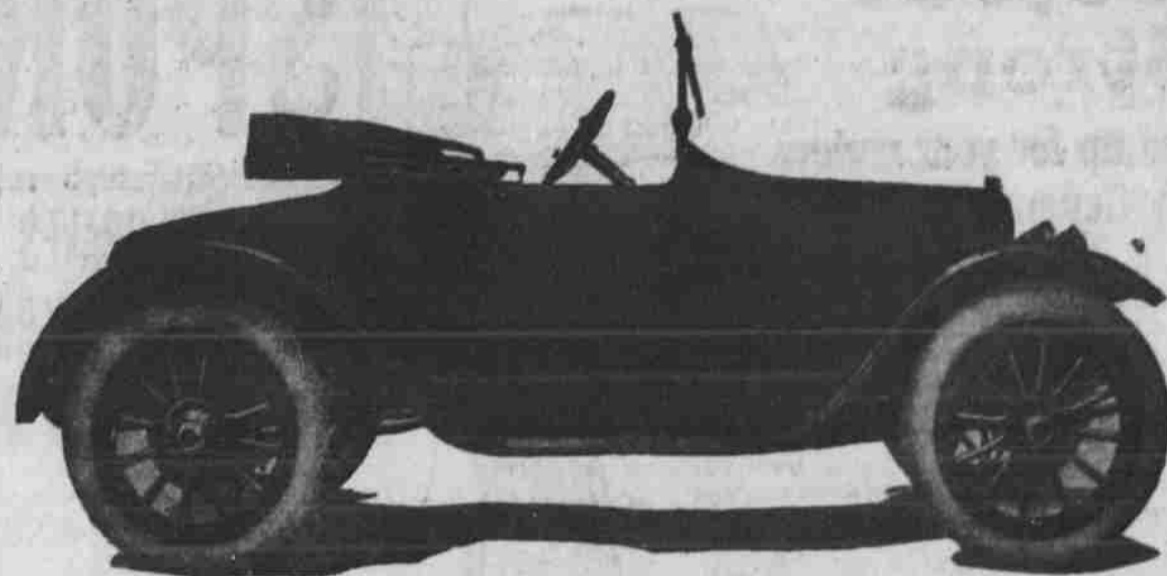
Mrs. Winship of Athena, who was appointed administrator of the estate of her late father, John Martin, in this county, is looking after business in the city today.
