NEWS OF FARM AND RANGE

FREE LEASE OFFERED BY O-W OF LAND ON ITS RIGHT OF WAY

Having a good many acres of good farming land within its right of way between Yoakum and Gibbon in this county, the O. W. R. & N. Co. has made an offer to lease this land free of charge if it will be cropped and further volunteers to furnish the seed for sowing it if the lessee has not the means with which to purchase it.

Local Agent T. F. O'Brien this morning received a letter from Supt. W. Bollins notifying him of the policy of the company. The letter calls attention to the fact that there are a number of tracts within the right-of-way which are adapted to cultivation. These will be leased free to employees, ex-employees who have been laid off on account of the reduction in assistance or to any poor or needy persons. Mr. O'Brien is instructed to canvass the local situation as soon as possible in order that the land may be cultivated at once. He will take the matter up with the city and county authorities. Formal application for the land must be made to Supt. Bollins through the local agent.

BIDS ADVERTISED FOR CHEESE TO BAIT TRAPS

MINNEAPOLIS, March 27.—The post office of Minneapolis is today advertising for bids for a hunk of cheese.

Recently, Old Tabby, brigadier general in the warfare against rats, was rendered hors de combat in a frontal assault upon an enemy of unknown strength. Tabby found out the strength of that position, and unwilling to make strategic retreat, went down with her colors.

COMMISSION UPHELDS RATES TO THE WEST

WASHINGTON, March 27.—In a ruling of the interstate commerce commission it was held that twenty-one door and sash manufacturers in Iowa, Illinois and Wisconsin, who attacked the carload rates charged by the Southern Pacific and other roads from California, Oregon and Washington to the three states had failed to prove that such rates were unreasonable.

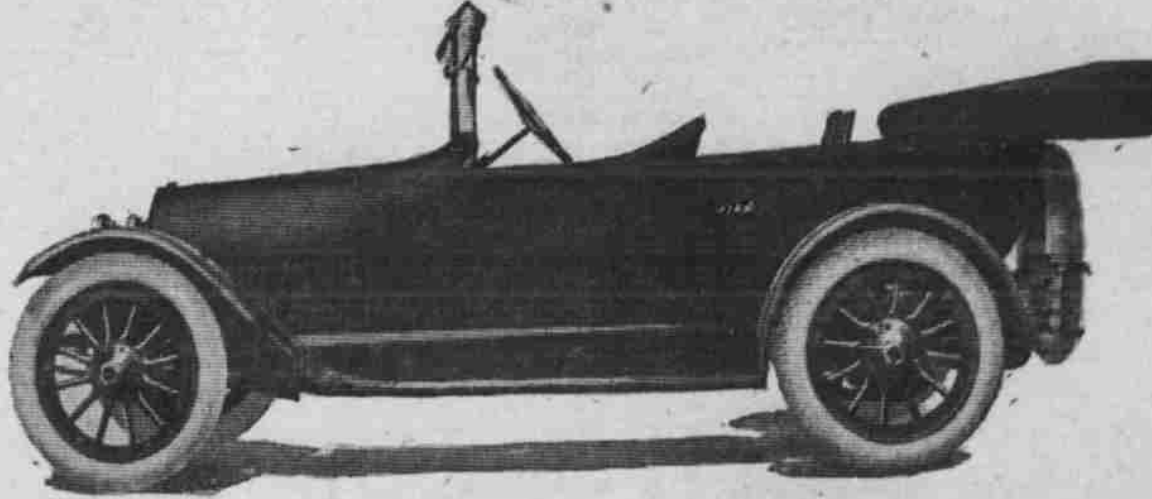
