EXHIBIT OF MANUAL TRAINING PRODUCTS TO BE HELD 2 DAYS

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS' HAND- WORK ON SHOW IN THE MOOSE HALL.

Domestic Science Department Also to Exhibit—Will Open Tomorrow Afternoon and Continue Until Friday—Exhibit is Larger Than Any Other Held Herebefore.

Tomorrow and Friday afternoons and evenings at the Moose hall the manual training and domestic science departments of the high school will hold their annual exhibit. This exhibit will be larger and more comprehensive than any of the preceding ones.

The high school woodwork and mechanical drawing, the sixth, seventh and eighth grade woodwork, and the work of the night school will be shown.

The work of the high school includes joinery, woodturning, cabinet making, drafting and architectural and machine drawing. Over two hundred pieces of furniture will be shown. These pieces include work in mahogany, oak, gum, fir and cedar.

Domestic Science Exhibit. The Domestic Science classes will cook and serve in the afternoons and evenings, demonstrating some of their school work. The following is their program:

- Thursday at 3 o'clock—Meats, bread and rolls, salads.
Thursday evening at 7:30—Biscuits, coffee.
Friday, 3 p. m.—Biscuits, coffee, meat cutting demonstration.
Friday evening—Cookies, tea, coffee.

Tables will be arranged for study by the housewife. "Table on what to do in an emergency." "How to give the baby the best care."

"Foods equivalent to a quart of milk in food value." These have all been studied and prepared by the advanced class in domestic science.

Sewing Exhibit. This will be the largest exhibit of its kind ever shown here. There will be sewing by the sixth, seventh and eighth grade girls, and the beginning high school girls and machine work by the second year ones. The advanced class work in suits is very efficient for high school girls. The girls have also learned to care for a sewing machine properly. They will be only too glad to clean any machine sent to the Moose hall during the exhibit.

The exhibit will be held for two days in the afternoons and evenings. There will be no admission charge.

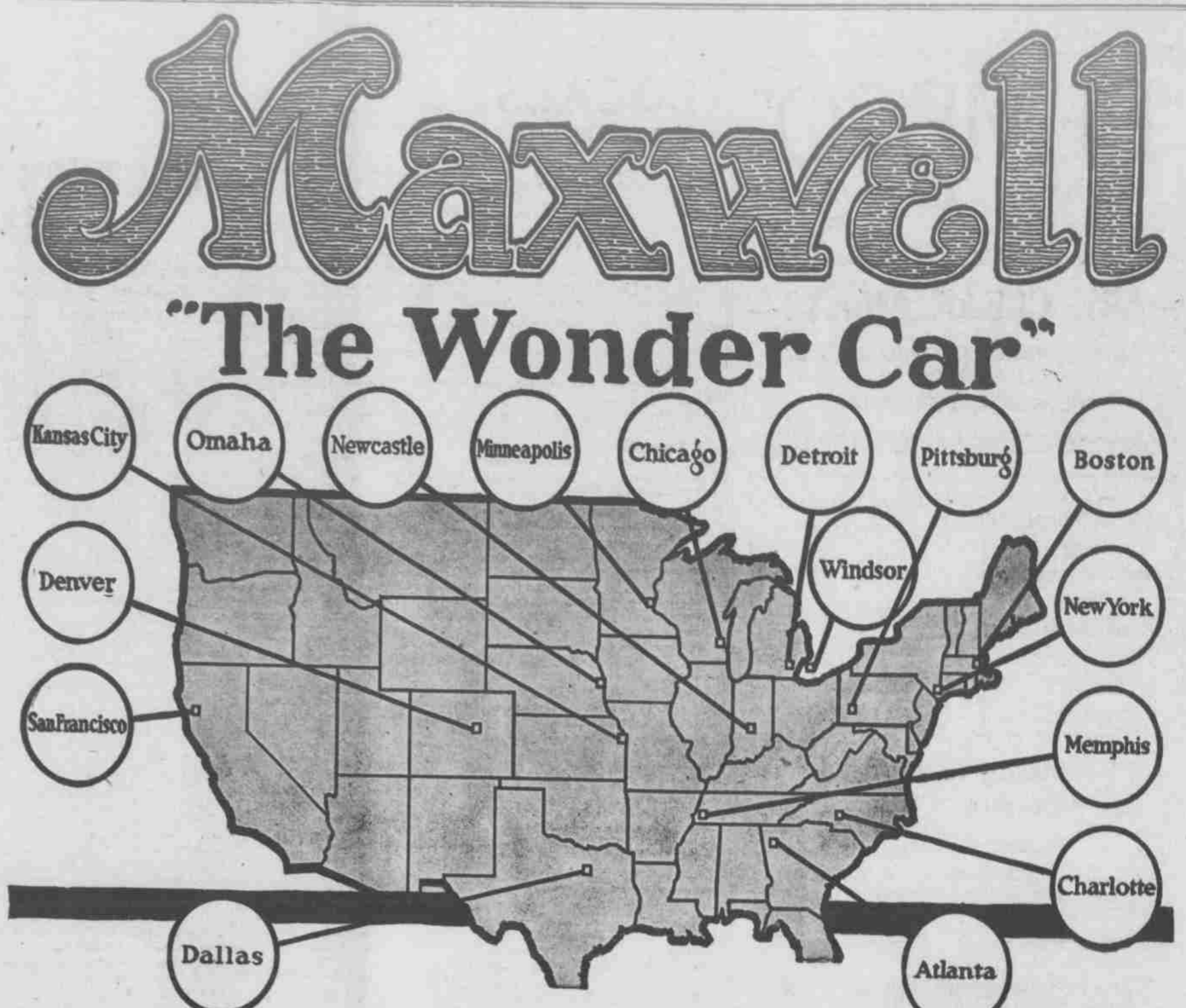
SAN FRANCISCO, May 5.—The public schools athletic league will hold its annual field meet at the exposition grounds.
