WHEAT DEMAND HOLDS STEADY

PORTLAND, Ore.—

An aside from the

hogs which packers are guaranteeing

the price at \$8 in their fight for Willamette valley supplies against the dressed meat trade of Front street, killers are not offering above \$7.50 for tops in the yards at his time.

As a rule Willamette valley stuff is

sold at 5 to 10c less than best

east of the mountain offerings but

since the fight started between pack-

ing interests, killers have paid even

more for the swine of this section

than for the better offerings else-

where.

There was a fair run of hogs in the

yards at the opening of the day's

trade but sales started very slow, in-

dicating a continuance of the slow

pace of yesterday.
