KILLERS HOLD CATTLE PRICES

(Courtesy Wednesday's Journal.) PORTLAND, Ore.—Aside from the hogs which packers are guaranteeing the price at \$3 in their fight for Willamette valley supplies against the dressed meat trade of Front street, killers are not offering above \$7.50 for tops in the yards at his time. As a rule Willamette valley stuff is sold here at 5 to 10c less than best east of the mountain offerings, but since the fight started between packing interests, killers have paid even more for the same of this section than for the better offerings elsewhere.

There was a fair run of hogs in the yards at the opening of the day's trade but sales started very slow, indicating a continuance of the slow tone of yesterday. WHEAT DEMAND HOLDS STEADY

(Wednesday's Market.) PORTLAND, Ore.—Quite fair demand for wheat is showing again and prices are holding somewhat better. The report was spread that a cargo of wheat had been sold to Vladivostok, but the exporter says that he is uncertain whether the shipment is eventually for that port, Australia or Japan. In connection with the report that the cargo may go to the English colonies, the following from U. S. Consul W. A. Bickers, at Hobart, Tasmania, is of very much interest: "Referring to the Hobart consulate's earlier report on wheat, in which it was stated that Tasmania was in the market for large quantities of wheat, it has since been announced that two cargoes have been obtained from Argentina and one from the United States. These cargoes are considered to be ample for local needs until December, at which time the local crop will be coming on the market."

"The wheat from Argentina will be delivered in April and that from the United States in July. The price at Hobart is about \$2 per bushel." Grain bag importers are forcing prices higher under the pretext that shipments will not arrive in time for harvest. It was stated some time ago that practically all the big shipments were already en route to the Pacific coast from Hongkong, therefore it begins to look as if importers intend to squeeze every possible fraction out of the market.

Oats were higher. Provisions were up at the outset.
