This Correspondent Almost Got Interview With Prince George on the way to Rome

Note—This is the first of a series of three stories by Mr. Shepherd, correspondent of the United Press, in which he relates his experiences in Italy.

BY WILLIAM G. SHEPHERD. (United Press Staff Correspondent.) ROME, July 1.—(By Mail)—I have been to the Italian front, but I came right back to Rome again, quick.

Here's the story. A hot June evening in the Cafe de Lyon in Paris; people fussy; because of the heat; engines belching smoke in the big train shed.

On the platform besides the sleeping car stands an odd collection of persons. A tall, splendid looking man, in tennis clothes, and a tall, handsome woman, are chatting with two elderly ladies.

The conductor blows his horn. The two elderly women bend their knees to the tall graceful woman and to the tall man.

"That's the brother of the king of Greece," the conductor tells you later in the evening, when he collects your ticket.

He was an exile from Crete, you know, until Venizelos got out of office and now he's going back again.

In the morning we'll get a newspaper interview with this tall brother of a king.

That night after you get to sleep a man comes into your stateroom and begins to undress.

Well, it's all part of going to the front. The valet of the brother of the King of Greece climbs into the berth below you and snores just like any other valet.
