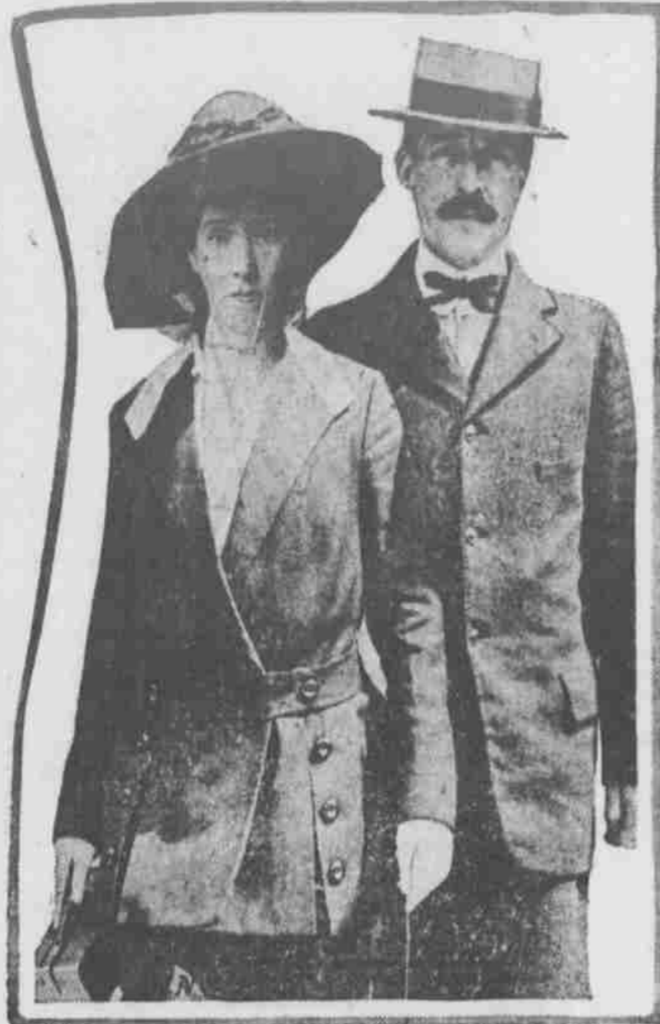

Sales of ordinary lambs were made at \$5.50 this morning in the local yards which means fully 15% for topsy stuff, a price forecast in these reports during recent days. Only a very nominal amount of mutton arrived for the market today and the finished condition of the general trade soon forced the sale of these at the price quoted.
