

# SWINE MARKET HOLDS STEADY

 PORTLAND, Ore.—Market for swine was under severe pressure at North Portland today with a very heavy run and killers in full control of the price situation. Today's run is even greater than last Monday when there was so much depression in the early trade.

Market for swine was generally steady this morning in the east, little change being shown in quotations. General hog market range:

While some sales of cattle were again made in a limited way at the former top mark—\$7.00 for extreme quality steers—the general market was softer in spots and fractionally lower. There was a very liberal run reported in the pens over Sunday, totals being 1511 head compared with 1074 head last week. The fact that there was very liberal marketing of cattle from Idaho points indicated that country reports of better prices available in that territory from eastern buyers have not been accurate.

**\$100 OFFERED FOR BLOOD.**  
 CHICAGO, Sept. 11.—Unless some healthy man about 30 years old comes forward to claim the \$100 offered by John R. Thompson, there is almost no chance of recovery for Adolf A. Doleys, 3575 Vincennes avenue. Mr. Doleys has been ill for three months and his system has been weakened by the continued loss of blood caused by a hemorrhage of the stomach.

Mr. Doleys is general superintendent of the Thompson restaurants in Chicago and a friend of John R. Thompson. It is this which prompted Mr. Thompson to have the following advertisement inserted:

"Personal—I will give \$100 to a healthy man, about 29 years old, who will give some blood to a friend whom the doctor says cannot live unless he gets this infusion; this is urgent. Call Monday or Tuesday after 9 a. m. Mr. Thompson, 350 North Clark street."

"Mr. Doleys has been ill for three months," said Mr. Thompson. "He has lost so much blood that the physicians say he has only about 25 per cent of the blood he should have. The trouble, as I understand it, is a stomach hemorrhage."

"The doctor says there is no chance for recovery without the infusion and that even then it is doubtful. But I am willing to do anything I can to make the infusion possible."
