Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received by the secretary of the Umatilla county library board at her address, Pendleton, Oregon, until 12 o'clock noon, September 30, 1915 for the construction of a library building approximately 42x62 feet, of basement, main floor and attic, including approaches and grading or lot. Plans and specifications can be obtained from Mrs. Lina H. Sturgis, president of the library board, Pendleton, Oregon, by making a deposit of \$20.00 which will be refunded to unsuccessful bidders on return of the plans and specifications in good condition. Plans and specifications are also on file in the public library at Pendleton on the second floor of the city hall, where they may be inspected. Each bid for all the work shall be accompanied by a certified check up on a national bank drawn to the order of the Umatilla county court, to the amount of five per cent of the bid, binding the bidder to execute the work if awarded to him. All such deposits, except that of the accepted bidder, will be returned within one week after the contracts have been awarded. Failure of the successful bidders to furnish bond called for herein within one week after the contract has been awarded will result in the award of the work being rescinded and given another bidder; and the certified check of the defaulting bidder will become liable up to its full amount of any difference in the amounts of the two bids. The successful bidder will be required to furnish a satisfactory bond, in amount one-half the contract price, executed by a Surety company acceptable to the county court, and qualified to do business in the state of Oregon, such bond insuring the fulfillment of all the provisions of the contract and the satisfactory completion of the work thereunder within the time stated, and covering all guarantees provided for in the specifications, the prompt payment of all persons furnishing materials or labor required for the prosecution of the work and the settlements of all claims, liens or other liabilities arising from the construction of the work or the use of patented articles. Pupils Fitted for Jobs. PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 15.—Every child in the public schools is being adapted to fit children for industrial and commercial positions when they leave school, according to an announcement yesterday of Dr. John P. Garber, acting superintendent of schools. For the first time in the history of elementary schools, handicraft work will be incorporated in the work of every grade. The courses will be developed so that no matter at what time a child leaves school, he or she will be equipped for some work in the outside world. Dr. Garber is in correspondence with big manufacturers and business firms in the city to find out what handicraft they think will be most useful to younger boys and girls. Spelling, arithmetic, English and history all have been revised along practical "read-winning" lines, and from the day the children first enter school they will give from one to two periods a week to study the rudiments of trade work. The course in handicraft for the first to third grades has been outlined by William A. Mason, director of drawing; John C. Frazee, associate superintendent, is in charge of the industrial training in all other grades. Special teachers will direct the work of the fourth, fifth and sixth grades in the regular schoolrooms. In the seventh and eighth grades advanced carpentry and mental work will be taught the boys in manual shops, while the girls learn to cook in school kitchen centers. "The work has all been arranged in harmony with the requirements of the child labor law," Dr. Garber said. "We do not intend to neglect the culture side of education, but we want to train every boy and girl for his life work as well."
