

through three centuries. She marked the beginning and the end of England's monstrous penal

She is the oldest rhip in the world and the only convict ship left ariout out of that dreadful Fleet of Hells which safled the Seven Seas In 1790 A. D.

She is unchanged after all these years, nothing being ommitted but her human freight and their sufferings from the cruelties and burbarities practiced upon them.

Aboard her are shown, in their original state, the airless dungeons, death chambers and condemned whipping posts, the manacles, the branding Irons, the punishment balls, the leaden-tipped cut-o'-nine talls, the coffin bath and the other flendish inventions of man's brutality to his fellow man.

She has held lurid horror and dreadful in!quities beside which even the terrible stories of the Black Hole of Calcutta and the Spanish Inquisition pale into insignificance.

From keel to topmast she cries aloud the greatest lesson the world has ever known in the history of human progress.

The "Success" was built in 1796 A. D., at Moulimain Burmah of solid tonkword logs 39 inches thick and used for some years as an armed East Indian merchantman. was chartered and used by the British government for transporting convicts to the colonies. From 1851 she was used by the government as a floating prison anchored in Hobson's Bay.

She was subsequently sunk in Sydney Harhor and after being under water about five years was raised and has been used for exhibition purposes. In 1912 stre sailed unscompanied convoy from England to America, taking 96 days to do the journey.

This is reported to have necessitated the presence of eastern buyers in northwestern markets. where the quality is of the finest.
