There was desperate fighting all along the western front with few changes in the situation. The French war office reported slight advances on the heights of the Meuse, and the Germans reported the capture of a fort near St. Mihiel.

The Russian general staff reported that the German army which was retreating before the Russian advance had been forced to evacuate fortified positions between Wihalen and Lyck.

The Belgian authorities at Antwerp warned non-combatants that the city was about to be bombed.

The French fleet was laying mines in the Adriatic to offset similar action by the Austrians.

PRISONER PAROLED TO HARVEST "WHEAT CROP"

LOCAL PEOPLE MAY WELL WONDER JUST WHAT KIND OF CROP IT IS.

After reading the following item from the Portland Telegram, local people may well wonder what kind of a crop Joe Picard is raising in this county:

Joe Picard, white, left for his home in Eastern Oregon this morning to harvest his wheat crop. November 15 he will come back to serve a two-months' sentence in the county jail.

Picard pleaded guilty before Federal Judge Wolverton this morning to a charge of taking six dozen bottles of beer on the Umatilla reservation. He was given the minimum sentence of 60 days, \$100 and costs.

"Your honor," said Assistant United States District Attorney Rankin, after sentence had been passed; "this man says that right now his wheat crop ought to be harvested. He is willing to come back and serve his sentence when he is through. As this is his first offense, the government has no objection."

"All right," said the judge. Picard lives on an Indian allotment on the Umatilla reservation.

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LIVESTOCK RUNS ARE NOT SO BIG

(Courtesy Monday's Journal.) PORTLAND, Ore.—Receivers were asking more money for hogs today at North Portland because of the big decrease in offerings as compared with last Monday.

With Chicago quoting as high as \$5.25 for hogs this morning the trade here was inclined to believe that it should be getting more money, especially as there was a very serious decrease in total offerings.

Eastern hog markets were generally quoted at an advance this morning. General hog market range: Best light \$4.35 @ \$4.40, Medium light \$4.20 @ \$4.25, Good to heavy \$4.10 @ \$4.25, Rough to heavy \$3.90 @ \$4.00.

Cattle Run Decreased. In the cattle market the showing of supplies at the opening of the week's trade or only fractionally more than half as much as last Monday.

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QUAKE RIPS SCHOOL BASE AT BAKER CITY
BAKER, Ore., Oct. 5.—The most serious damage done by Saturday night's earthquake was found with the opening of the school when a large crack in the east side of the Brooklyn school building foundation extending from tom to ootom, was discovered. The interior of the building was not damaged and efforts to repair it at once will be made. Reports from the outside districts show that the quake extended north and south of Baker in a narrow strip, Huntington, La Grande, Haines and North Powder feeling the shake, but points 20 miles east or west felt no tremors.
