election. He dealt with the question from a scientific angle, declaring that a cold, scientific analysis proved that alcohol is an agency of human degeneracy, physical, mental, moral and economic, and that it is the greatest scourge of mankind. He concluded his address with a dramatic recital of the sinking of the *Marimac* in Santiago harbor to show that he and the men with him were not heroes but average men doing their duty.

Before Captain Hobson spoke, Dr. Edwin I. Stearns of New York made an eloquent appeal for aid in fighting the liquor evil. The rally was opened with music, Mrs. Carl Power singing a beautiful selection and the audience singing "America." Rev. H. H. Hubbel of the Christian church gave the invocation. Judge S. A. Lowell presided and introduced the speakers.

"A nation that dissipates," said Captain Hobson, "becomes a degenerate nation and dies. This is a law of nature. Now, our only chance to save ourselves is to cut from around our necks the millstone of alcohol, the habit-forming poison that produces degeneracy. The disease is organic—we must cut out every cancerous root—we must not leave a wet state in the Union to become a center of refection relapse. An amendment to the constitution, the organic law of the land, is the only means to insure that the next generation will grow up sober."

Liquor Traffic Benefits Few.
Repeatedly through his speech Captain Hobson insisted on the fact that the liquor traffic benefits financially only a few thousand brewers and distillers who are organized to perpetuate the profitable conduct of their business. All of liquor's evil effects, he said, are undergone for the sake of the profits made by this comparatively small class of citizens.

Doughnuts

That will remain moist.

Every housewife who bakes her own bread knows that if a little potato is added to the sponge, the bread will not dry out so quickly. In this recipe potato is utilized to make doughnuts that will remain moist and fresh for several days.

K C Potato Doughnuts

By Mrs. Nevada Briggs, of Baking School fame.

3/4 cups flour; 2 eggs; 1 cup sugar; 1 level teaspoonful K C Baking Powder; 1/2 teaspoonful salt; 1/2 teaspoonful milk; 1 cup cold mashed potato; 2 cup milk, or more if needed.



Sift three times, the flour, salt, spice and baking powder. Beat eggs with rotary beater, then still using rotary beater, gradually add sugar, then work in the mashed potato with a spoon and alternately add milk and flour mixture. Make a soft dough, roll into a sheet, cut into rounds, pinch a hole in the center with the finger and fry in deep fat.

Fat for frying should not be hot enough to brown the doughnut until it has risen. When the doughnut is dropped into the fat it sinks to the bottom. As soon as it comes up it should be turned and turned a number of times while cooking. This recipe is excellent as they do not take the fat in frying and will stay moist for days.

employment by the liquor traffic. This is not so. In proportion to the amount of money invested, very few are employed. And these people work on the lowest wage scale in any industry. The heavy taxes the liquor people claim to pay are more than offset by the heavy taxes the traffic makes necessary. So there you are from a business standpoint. The saloon man is the only business man who is allowed to levy a direct tax on the nation to keep going.

Are Poisoning Nation.
"A few thousand citizens, to carry on a stupendous business for the sake of their own wealth, prevent the nation from creating billions of dollars in new wealth. They are systematically poisoning the nation with what science has shown to be a habit-forming poison. And they expect you to perpetuate their regime, not for your own sake, but for theirs."

Life Goes Backward.
"Not only is alcohol a poison, pure and simple, according to science's latest researches, but it is habit-forming and inhibitive of the higher processes of evolution. Under its influence all forms of animal life move not ahead, but backward. Plants drop back in the scale of development, domestic animals revert to wildness, civilized men to savagery. There is absolutely no possibility of the human race ever becoming a race of thoroughbreds as long as it tolerates the use of alcohol, a specific for degeneracy. Lower species may breed thoroughbreds, because they have not this curse of nature to contend with."

"I can show you by mathematics based on the figures of life insurance agencies, that alcohol causes half the mortality in this country. There are 1,100,000 deaths in this country in a year. This would be cut to 1,000,000 if alcohol could be eliminated as a factor."

Alcohol Blasts Character.
"The soldier shot tonight in the Balkans is dead, but the bullet hasn't touched his character. The alcoholic who dies does not only with his tissues riddled, but with his moral sense paralyzed and his spiritual nature killed by the same agency that has destroyed his body."

"And then comes the worst tragedy of all—the blighting of offspring. This is nature's most radical weapon in destroying a race that abuses her laws. The deadliest attack alcohol makes is on the delicate germ protoplasm involved in reproduction. Even temperate drinking by parents contributes to the slaughter of the innocents that is always going on. When the parents are alcoholics they breed degenerates, and that's an end of it. Only total abstinence can go ahead on the safe assumption that their children will be sound stock, clean blooded and ready to continue the advancement of the race."

Count of Temperate Drinker.
"These few thousand brewers and distillers who are working with all their might to keep their business going count not only on the man who is a slave to the habit, but on the temperate drinker, who far outnumber the real alcoholics. Now the temperate drinker army is recruited from among the boys. Men do not form habits after they are grown. They are only 20 per cent of the adult men are total abstainers. If that is so it means that four out of every five boys are caught by liquor in some form."

"Not only does the liquor business expect its slaves to contribute money to the nation in high enough to win this fight?"

Captain Hobson's audience was an intensely interested one and that his telling point went home was evidenced by the attention and applause with which they were received. Their interest, too, was manifested in the generous contributions and pledges made in response to a plea made by Dr. Edwin I. Stearns of New York, who preceded the principal speaker. Dr. Stearns is a lecturer for the National Anti-Slavery League and he asked for funds to assist in financing the fight against alcohol.

BAKER Y. M. C. A. MAY BE MADE A ROOMING HOUSE
MORTGAGE OF \$15,000 LIKELY TO BE FORECLOSED WITHIN A WEEK.

BAKER, Ore., Nov. 17.—Within one week the \$15,000 mortgage held by S. A. Underwood against the Y. M. C. A. building will be foreclosed, is the warning given by Mr. Underwood to the officials of the association. The mortgage falls due November 21, and it is Mr. Underwood's plan, unless the principal on the loan is turned in by that time, to transform the \$40,000 building into a rooming house. An architect has already inspected the building with a view to remodeling it.

French Line Quiet.
PARIS, Nov. 17.—A pronounced lull in the fighting along the entire line in France and Flanders was announced in the official communique of the French war office.

LONDON SUFFRAGISTS WANT ASQUITH TO GO

LONDON, Nov. 17.—The suffragettes are stirring anew in England after keeping under cover for months. A mass meeting they had planned for Thursday, having been cancelled by the authorities, Emmeline Pankhurst, the leader, announced defiantly it will be held elsewhere. At the same time she charged the government wished to hush up public protests against the "betrayal of Serbia."

The suffragettes advertised they would demand a "loyal and vigorous conduct of the war," and it is expected they wish to demand the removal of Premier Asquith and Foreign Minister Grey, because of their diplomatic defeat in the Balkans.
