EVENTS OF WAR

Germany's request for an armistice in the Argonne was refused, England threatened further steps to protect her interests if the U. S. didn't curb Ecuador's and Colombia's wireless stations' activities in connection with the Germans.

Kaiser Demands Action.
LONDON, Nov. 24.—A dispatch to the Times from Petrograd gives a report by German prisoners of a meeting between Emperor William and Field Marshal von Hindenburg, at which the Emperor insisted that another attempt be made to take Riga and Dvinsk at all cost. The field marshal is reported to have demanded reinforcements, which the Emperor refused on the ground that the men could not be spared from other fronts.

Death Cuts Romp Short.
SOUTH BEND, Wash., Nov. 24.—Only a few hours after he had guided a Northern Pacific train into South Bend, James Foster, with the road more than 20 years, and one of the best known locomotive engineers in the northwest, dropped dead in the Kentucky hotel here.

Submarine Is Sunk.
ROME, Nov. 24.—Franco-Italian torpedo catchers were reported to have destroyed an Austrian submarine in the Mediterranean.

Police Sees City Rules.
PARIS, Nov. 24.—President Poincaré visited Pont-a-Mousson, which has sustained 176 bombardments since the opening of hostilities. The town virtually is deserted.

City Regulation Pends.
OREGON CITY, Nov. 24.—The city council will make no effort to regulate jitneys operating between Oregon City and Portland until the supreme court makes its decision in the case appealed from the ruling of Circuit Judge Bagley. Judge Bagley held the ordinance unconstitutional.

Colony Calls Out 10,000.
CAPE TOWN, via London, Nov. 24.—The government recruiting committee has called for another 10,000.
