### Benedict Leaves Vatican.

ROME, Nov. 24.—Pope Benedict has made an important departure from the custom of the pontiffs by visiting the Church of Saint Anna, adjoining the Apostolic Palace, and thus going outside the vatican precincts, according to the newspaper Giornale d'Italia.

Since the fall of temporal power, one form of papal protest against the new order of things has been the seclusion of the pontiff in the Vatican.

### Guilt of Killing Cattle.

ROSEBURG, Ore., Nov. 24.—After deliberating less than four hours a jury in the circuit court returned a verdict finding Charles Briggs guilty of larceny. Briggs was accused of killing and selling three cattle belonging to William Vinson of Colossus Valley. Joe West, also implicated, pleaded guilty several days ago and was sentenced from one to 20 years.

### Dredge Makes Rapid Progress.

KELSO, Wash., Nov. 24.—The Collier & Stevenson dredge which recently completed the lower unit of the dike project in dike district number two adjacent to Kelso, is now making rapid progress on the upper unit above the Pacific highway bridge. A rock cut on the Easton place delayed progress for a few days, but now the dredge is cutting a channel for a distance of about 200 feet every day.

### Corn Sold to Germany.

BERLIN, Nov. 24.—Bulgaria has sold to the German buying commission 20,000 tons of corn for immediate export on the Danube river, according to the Overseas News Agency. It is expected shipments will be in progress by the way of the Nish-Belgrade railway soon.

Under an agreement just completed the entire Bulgarian surplus of provisions and fodder will be placed at the disposal of Germany.

### MAN IS NEAR DEATH WHEN LOST IN STORM

### KAMELA ENGINEER IS LOST AND FRIENDS FIND HIM EXHAUSTED

LA GRANDE, Ore., Nov. 24.—Engineer Geo. Hillman of Kamela, had a most unpleasant experience yesterday, when he was overcome with exhaustion on a snowshoe trip through the mountains. Starting early in the morning while the snow was hard and dry, his long snowshoes carried him over the mountainous country at a rapid rate. Shortly before noon, however, a heavy thaw began to melt the snow, making the long wood perambulators worse than useless in the soft snow in places. To add to the difficulties Hillman lost the direct route home, necessitating about five or six miles additional walking. When he finally reached the railroad several miles from Kamela he abandoned the snowshoes, but was so completely exhausted that he fell a number of times before reaching the station. Before friends could remove his wet clothing he lost consciousness and for several hours friends and a trained nurse worked with him, before he finally fell into a restful sleep. He is little the worse for his experience today.

NEW YORK, Nov. 24.—Thirty X-Ray specialists, dentists, surgeons, physicians and specialists on diseases

of the eyes, nose and throat, and thirty nurses, sailed from here on the Nordam for the war zone, composing the Harvard Medical Unit.

Dr. David Cheever, who was in charge of the party, is a member of the Harvard Medical School faculty.

He said the unit was entirely neutral but had volunteered for the British government in preference to the other belligerents.

The expenses of the party will be borne by the British government and friends of Harvard University.
