WAR PROFITS CONSERVED. BERLIN, Nov. 30.—The federal council has adopted a preliminary bill for taxing the war profits of joint stock companies and corporations. The measure does not levy a tax. This is left for another bill after the war.
The present bill merely requires that companies carry as reserves half the profits earned in making war supplies and invest them separately from the ordinary resources, holding them in readiness for final decision.

ALL RECORDS BROKEN IN HOGS; MARKET IS HOLDING UP STRONG

(Courtesy The Journal.) PORTLAND, Ore.—All records were smashed for hog arrivals at North Portland for the month of November.
There was only a small run reported in the yards over night following the record showing of Monday. General trade conditions continued steady, with top quoted at \$6.80, the former range.
There was a showing of weakness in some of the leading eastern hog markets during the day, with prices lower.

New Liner Off for Isles. SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 29.—The liner Great Northern sailed from here with a passenger list of 400 on her initial trip to the Hawaiian Islands to establish a four and one-half day service between there and Pacific coast ports. She will call at Los Angeles and Honolulu, T. H., on the voyage to Honolulu, but will return directly from Honolulu to San Francisco.
The new schedule shortens by a day the customary time required for the voyage.
