**UNITED STATES SENDS
SHARP NOTE OVER THE
SINKING OF STEAMER**

**AUSTRIA IS CALLED ON TO DIS-
AVOW TORPEDOING OF
THE ANCONA.**

WASHINGTON, Dec. 9.—A vigor-
ous protest against the sinking of the
steamer Ancona by an Austrian sub-
marine has been sent to Austria by
Secretary of State Lansing. It was
learned that the note was sent fol-
lowing Tuesday's cabinet meeting.

Demands made on Austria are:
That the government disavow the
act.
That reparations and indemnities be
given Americans concerned.
That assurances be given that there
will be no repetition of such warfare.
That the submarine commander
guilty of the outrage be punished by
the government.

Austria's Action Promptly Protest.
Austria's unsatisfactory explanation
which conflicted with the official re-
ports of United States consuls at Al-
geria, Naples and Marseilles and the
report of Ambassador Page at Rome,
prompted the protest.

The Italian statement and the stories
of the survivors were widely at
variance with Austria's version of
the facts.

The United States takes the unquali-
fied position that it has been estab-
lished that the Ancona was attacked
without warning.

Passengers' Lives Endangered.
It is also held as an established fact
that the ship was fired upon while
lifeboats were being filled with pas-
sengers.

These conclusions are reached by
this government despite the sweeping
denial in Austria's first statement of
the allegations of the American sur-
vivors and the Italian government,
which were denounced as "mendac-
ious inventions."

A second dispatch from Australia
were to the effect that a report could
not be made until the statement of
the submarine commander was ob-
tained.
