**PORTLAND, Ore.**—The big meat companies are gradually rounding up their holdings of mutton and lambs and getting them ready for the killing pens, because of the general lack of offering on the open market. The Union Meat company during the day drove 1000 head from its nearby feeding lots through the yards. Aside from these there was only a very nominal supply in the yards.
