**WILL HE SMILE AFTER MARCH 1.**

**KYLE OF STANFIELD IS CANDIDATE FOR STATE COMMISSION**

MAJOR OF UMATILLA COUNTY FOWN WILL BE IN RACE NEXT MAY.

Formal Announcement is Made of Candidacy for the Republican Nomination as Public Service Commissioner from Eastern Oregon—Letters Are Sent Out.

In circular letters explaining the purposes and importance of the Oregon public service commission, Mayor James M. Kyle of Stanfield today formally announces his candidacy for the republican nomination for the position of commissioner from eastern Oregon at the primary next May. An act introduced by Representative R. W. Ritter of this county in the last legislature provides that one of these commissioners shall come from eastern Oregon.

The following is a copy of the announcement of Mr. Kyle:

"The legislature of the state of Oregon, at the session of 1915, by enactment, changed the name of the railroad commission to that of public service commission, and at the same time provided that one member of the commission should be a resident of eastern Oregon. It did so because the majority of the representatives and senators representing the people of the state realized the importance of having on the commission at least one member who should be acquainted with the vast and varied resources and development of the great empire lying east of the Cascade mountains.

"So tremendous are these resources and so immense the necessary development, which is now only commencing, that few citizens of Oregon residing outside of this section have had opportunity to acquaint themselves with their magnitude. Some Portland capitalists recently made a survey of the potential resources of southeastern Oregon and so impressed were they that they hastened home to finance a much needed new railway for that section.

"Returning prosperity will induce capital to undertake new developments in irrigation, re-planting and unproductive soil, stimulate the mining and livestock industries, and give additional impulse to the diversified farming essential to success in existing and prospective irrigation districts.

"All this development is going to require discriminating encouragement, skillful assistance of capital and wise management, if the results shall be successful and permanent.

"The state has its part to perform in this program. Individual enterprise will take the initiative, properly enough, but the state, through its public officials, must be ready to meet changing conditions as development progresses; to assist in marketing and transportation problems; to lend advantage where needed; to render encouragement and assistance when deserving and proper.

"In the new era of progress and development, one of the most important state offices to the people of eastern Oregon, is that of commissioner of public service. Having spent a number of years in business in Umatilla county along lines that have developed a wide acquaintance with the various needs and advantages and resources peculiar to each of the several counties and communi-

**85,000 City Pupils Ill.**

CHICAGO, Dec. 24.—Approximately 85,000 pupils of the public schools are absent on account of a wave of influenza which is sweeping over the city, according to reports of school physicians made to the health department.

**MOONSHINERS FROM LANE COUNTY FINED AND SENT TO JAIL**

JUDGE WOLVERTON OF PORTLAND IMPOSES PENALTY ON 2 VIOLATORS.

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 23.—Martin C. Brown and James Williams, convicted Lane county moonshiners, were each sentenced to pay a \$500 fine, and Brown was sentenced to six and Williams to nine months in the county jail by Judge Wolverton in the federal court.

It was shown at the trial that the men made whiskey in a still at Leesburg, a remote community up the McKenzie river from Eugene.

Judge Wolverton said that on the recommendation of the jury, he would impose light sentences.

Asked by the court if they had anything to say, Brown said that he was not guilty, but that he would quit drinking. Williams admitted his guilt, and said he would not do it again.

As a possible indication of what moonshiners will receive in Oregon, Brown and Williams have both been in jail about five months, which, with their sentences, makes their total time a year or more, besides their fines.

Assistant United States Attorney Rankin prosecuted the Brown-Williams case.

**WHEAT CROP JUMPS HIGHER.**

Northern Hemisphere Produces Total of 4,590,000,000 Bushels.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 24.—The Northern Hemisphere in 1915 produced 4,590,000,000 bushels of wheat, an increase of 19.4 per cent over 1914, a telegram from the international institute of agriculture at Rome to the bureau of crop estimates says.

The United States produced two-sevenths of this amount.

No mention was made of the southern hemisphere's crop.

**PIECES SOAR IN TURKEY.**

Ottoman Women Organize Meetings of Protest and Are Dispersed.

PARIS, Dec. 24.—The opening of railroad communication from Turkey to Austria and Germany has resulted in a considerable increase in the price of necessities of life in Turkey, says a Hava dispatch from Athens.

Turkish women organized meetings of protest in Constantinople, which, the dispatch adds, were dispersed by troops.

**Turks Attacking Allies.**

SALONIKI, Dec. 24.—Artillery bombardment and fierce infantry attacks by the Turks on the British-Socialist front were reported in a wireless dispatch received by the British station here from a British warship in the Dardanelles.

This attack is evidently a supreme effort by the Sultan's forces to clear the peninsula, it was declared.

**FRANZ VON RONTLEEN, GERMAN AGENT**



Evidence is now in the hands of U. S. government officials which tends to show that the German government through its secret agent, Franz von Rontlelen, spent huge sums of money in an attempt to embroil the United States and Mexico.

Von Rontlelen is now held by the English government as a German spy. A careful search of his baggage brought to light several letters from prominent society women in this country, and the information gleaned from these letters has materially aided the British secret service agents in this country.

Von Pintlen is now in the tower of London awaiting execution. He has such a fund of valuable information that his death has been postponed from time to time in the hope that he would confess to save his life. But he has stood firm and says that prominent society women in this country were not afraid to die.
