**Cattle Market
Holds Steady
for the Week**

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 1.—After
Christmas market on all kinds of
livestock usually is a dull affair. Yester-
day's market was no exception to
the rule, not enough cattle were in
the yards to test the strength of the
market. All lines are, however,
quoted steady with last week's top.
Top grain or pulp-fed steers would
bring \$7.50, other grades in propor-
tion.

Hogs.
Only a handful of hogs today, a to-
tal of 2500 were offered to the trade.
Last week's closing was at a strong
figure, and today's season put on a
top of \$6.25. This figure records an
advance of ten cents over last week.

Sheep.
The strength in the sheep market
was shown in a good sale of a dou-
ble deck of wethers at seven cents
weighed off the cars. This price
would indicate not only strength but
an advance in mutton values.

NEW YORK, Jan. 1.—It is reported
that the New York Yankees have
entered the field of those bidding for
the services of Benny Kauff, of the
Erookfelds and leading hitter of the

tiations are already under way and
that the New York club has offered
in the neighborhood of \$19,000 for
Kauff's contract.

erals. Manager McGraw of the Gi-
ants is also anxious to secure the ser-
vices of Kauff for next year, since
